Why Out-of-School Time (OST)?

Afterschool Benefits from Childhood to Adulthood:

Stronger Learners, Earners, Leaders

Young people who consistently participate in afterschool programs benefit in the short- and long-term, with positive impacts lasting into adulthood.



- 1 Improved school attendance
- **†** Higher grades
- 1 Improved social skills
- Increased positive relationships
 with peers and staff

- **†** Higher GPAs
- **†** Higher test scores
- **†** Higher graduation rates
- 1 Improved confidence
- Improved decision-making
 (reduced drug and alcohol use)

Strategic Plan Alignment

The work is aligned with the vision that Wake County's Cooperative Extension 4-H Youth Development program serves as the prevention services arm of the County for youth. It builds on the 2023 OST Inventory to re-establish a network of collaborating youth-serving providers missing since the loss of Youth Thrive in 2020. In the County Strategic Plan, it aligns with:

- **Lifelong Learning Goal 3:** Develop baseline metrics for education-based services in Wake County Public Schools by 2025.
 - Lifelong Learning Initiative 3.2: Convene community partners providing youth services to improve coordination, ensure access across all partners, address service gaps and increase community awareness.


In addition, there is potential alignment to explore with these additional areas:

- **Inclusive Prosperity Goal 1:** By 2029, 5% more residents will indicate low barriers to employment, such as access to broadband, childcare, and transportation.
 - o **Inclusive Prosperity Initiative 1.5**: Assess and develop strategies to strengthen the community's capacity to increase childcare services such as second and third shift childcare, workforce development for childcare service providers, and service navigation for families seeking childcare assistance and resources.
- **Inclusive Prosperity Goal 2:** By 2029, four out of five residents asked will say they have employment opportunities that are available and right for their needs.
 - Inclusive Prosperity Initiative 3: Improve service navigation for entrepreneurs and small business owners by streamlining access to local resources and fostering connections to expand business opportunities

- The Wake OST Network strengthens, expands, and sustains a coordinated ecosystem of OST programs that support the whole child, whole family, and whole community. Grounded in principles of positive youth development, the Network fosters collaboration across sectors to ensure all children and youth in Wake County have access to high-quality, culturally responsive, and developmentally enriching learning opportunities beyond the school day.
- 160 OST professionals engaged in the effort and it's growing everyday!

- The Mapping Database will serve as a resource for families to locate OST programs within their community that meet their needs. It will also serve as an internal tool to identify service gap areas within Wake.

 - Launch Date: October 2025
- 178 OST Programs Listed
- Spring 2026 Programs will be able to add their information to the map
 - Steering Committee will review and verify submissions
