Proclaiming the Third Saturday of April as
Nepal Day**

WHEREAS, Wake County and the surrounding area is home to nearly 8,000 Nepalese residents; and

WHEREAS, the Nepali community serves as a meaningful contributor to the social and economic vitality of the broader community; and

WHEREAS, comprising of diverse ethnic groups and more than 100 different languages, the Nepali community contributes to the rich cultural diversity of Wake County; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Nepal Center of North Carolina is to build strong relationships within the local community, preserve and promote Nepali culture and identity, and extend support to Nepal and the Nepalese community worldwide; and

WHEREAS, the Nepal Center of North Carolina is committed to supporting Nepali immigrants, students, professionals, and newcomers by providing access to information, guidance, and meaningful networking opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the Nepal Center of North Carolina strives to promote Nepalese art, literature, music, dance, and customs in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, members of the Nepal Center of North Carolina play an active role in the local community through initiatives including Adopt-a-Highway, civic engagement such as blood donation drives, and participation in the International Festival.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Wake County Board of Commissioners does hereby proclaim the third Saturday of April as **NEPAL DAY** in Wake County.
