

WAKE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCLAMATION Recognizing September 2025 as

Recognizing September 2025 as Preparedness Month

WHEREAS, the Wake County Board of Commissioners recognizes that Wake County is at risk for a multitude of hazards, including severe weather, biological events, hazardous materials incidents, nuclear emergencies, civil unrest, and other manmade or natural disasters; and

WHEREAS, according to the National Weather Service, thus far in 2025, Wake County has experienced 11 Heat Advisories, 2 Extreme Heat warnings, 7 Flood Watches, 30 Flood Advisories, 10 Flash Flood warnings, 7 Severe Thunderstorm Watches, 61 Severe Thunderstorm warnings, 5 Tornado watches, 1 Tornado Warning, 3 Wind Advisories, 1 Frost Advisory and 1 Freeze warning; and

WHEREAS, Hurricane Helene, Tropical Storm Chantal, and Hurricane Erin have demonstrated North Carolina's continued vulnerability to severe weather; and

WHEREAS, communities across Wake County have borne the impacts of severe weather, damaging hail, high winds and flooding; and

WHEREAS, communities across Wake County have experienced civil unrest, nuclear emergency declarations, significant hazmat incidents; and

WHEREAS, every community, business, family, and individual in Wake County are encouraged to be ready for natural and man-made disasters, including tornadoes, flooding, hurricanes, terrorism and other emergency situations that might disrupt normal daily activities; and

WHEREAS, all Wake County residents can take steps such as - making a family disaster plan, creating an emergency supply kit, and staying informed - to help make preparedness and personal responsibility a priority; and

WHEREAS, Wake County residents should know and understand the risks for their area and plan accordingly; and

WHEREAS, Wake County recommends residents include the safety of their pets and/or livestock in their emergency plans; and

WHEREAS, September is recognized as National Preparedness Month to encourage North Carolinians and Wake County residents to be disaster ready;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wake County Board of Commissioners does hereby proclaim the month of September 2025, as **PREPAREDNESS MONTH** in Wake County, and urges the residents of our community to plan and prepared for weather-related and man-made disasters by assembling their emergency supply kits and updating their emergency plans.
