Phased Housing Approach



Two-Phase Housing Solution

- Renovation of Detention Annex in FY2025-27 for 240 additional minimum beds as a <u>temporary solution</u>.
- Build <u>Phase 3</u> of the Wake County Detention Center (448 "wet cell" beds) FY2025-FY29
- Build <u>Phase 4</u> of the Wake County Detention Center (min. 448 beds) FY2036-FY40



2024 Jail Data Update



Jail Average Daily Population (ADP)




- Wake County Jail ADP increased 75% from 2000 to 2024 YTD
- <u>2024 YTD</u> Jail ADP is 1,438

Jail Average Length of Stay (ALOS)



- Wake County Jail ALOS increased 43% from 2000 to 2024 YTD
- Lowest ALOS was in 2001 at 19.8 days; Highest ALOS is the most recent year 2022 at 36.3 days
- <u>2024 YTD</u> Jail ALOS is 30.1 days (still a significant increase from 2000-2020)

Jail Classification



- Minimum Security Inmates' percentage decreased from 53% percent to 34% from 2016 to 2024 YTD
- Maximum SecurityInmates percentageincreased from 13% in2016 to over 35% since2021 and is now thehighest percentageclassification

Increase of maximumsecurity inmates, along with longer ALOS, shows hardening of inmates being housed in Wake County




Detention Center – 2010 Master Plan


Approved FY25 Budget
