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Private Living Medicaid



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Private Living Programs

Basic Eligibility:

- Age 65 or over
- Blind
- Disabled

Full Medicaid

Medicaid for the **Aged** (MAA)

Medicaid for the **Blind** (MAB)

Medicaid for the **Disabled** (MAD)

Health Coverage for **Workers with Disabilities** (HCWD)

Limited Medicaid

Medicaid for **Qualified Medicare Beneficiaries** (MQB)

Dual Eligibility

Income Guidelines

- **Full Medicaid** – Income at or below **100% Federal Poverty Level (FPL)**
 - MAD
 - MAA
 - MAB
- **Full Medicaid** – Income at or below **200% Federal Poverty Level (FPL)**
 - HCWD (with no premium)



Income Guidelines

- **Limited Medicaid** – Income at or below **100% Federal Poverty Level (FPL)**
 - MQB-Q
- **Limited Medicaid** – Income between **101% – 135% Federal Poverty Level (FPL)**
 - MQB-B
 - MQB-E



Resource Limits

- **Full Medicaid** – Countable resources at or below **\$2000 (individual) and \$3000 (couple)**
 - MAD
 - MAA
 - MAB
- **Full Medicaid** – Countable resources **at or below \$31,584**
 - HCWD
- **Limited Medicaid** – Countable resources **at or below \$9660 (individual) and \$14,470 (couple)**
 - MQB



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Long Term Care



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Long Term Care Medicaid

- Helps pay for cost of care in a **skilled nursing facility or intermediate care facility (ICF- intellectual disabilities)**.
- Reserve (asset) limit is \$2,000.00.
- For a married applicant with spouse at home, **a portion of the couple's assets can be protected** (not counted) for the community spouse.
- When computing the **patient monthly liability for a married applicant with a spouse at home**, an **allowance may be deducted** from the applicant's income **for the needs of the community spouse**.

Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)

&

Community Alternatives Program for Disabled Adults (CAP-DA)



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Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)

- Participants must be **55 years of age or older**.
- Meet the **North Carolina criteria for nursing home level of care and desire to continue living at home**.
- **Can live safely at home** with PACE services.
- Use a PACE Center that includes a **primary care clinic, therapy, personal care, and dining**.
- Must **reside in the service area** of a PACE Center.
- PACE services may be offered to participants **free of charge or by paying a Patient Monthly Liability depending on their income**.

Community Alternatives Program for Disabled Adults (CAP-DA)

- **CAP-DA** provides home and community-based services for adults who are **at risk of institutionalization**.
- Individuals must be a **disabled adult 18 years old and older**.
- Require a level of **institutional care**.
- **Need at least one or more home and community-based services based on need assessment** coordinated by a CAP/DA case manager.
- **Services provided** under the CAP/DA waiver include **adult day health, in home aide, respite services, meal preparation and delivery and equipment, modification and technology tools**.

Special Assistance



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Special Assistance

- A face- to face interview must be completed at Social Services with the Power of Attorney, Authorized Representative, Legal Guardian and/or Client.
- Helps pay for room and board in an assisted living facility or group home.
- Individuals must be age 65 or older or disabled and live in a residential facility approved for Special Assistance.
- Total Countable Monthly income cannot exceed the Basic Rate for Special Assistance (\$1429) and the Enhanced Rate for Special Assistance (\$1813).
- Reserve (asset) limit is \$2,000.00.
- Special Assistance beneficiaries pay the facility an amount equal to all their income minus \$90.00 (\$70.00 personal needs allowance + \$20.00 income disregard) each month.

Special Assistance In Home



The Special Assistance In Home (SAIH) Program for adults provides ongoing case management and a cash supplement to help low-income individuals who would like to remain at home safely but are at imminent risk of entering a residential facility.

Special Assistance In Home Eligibility Requirements

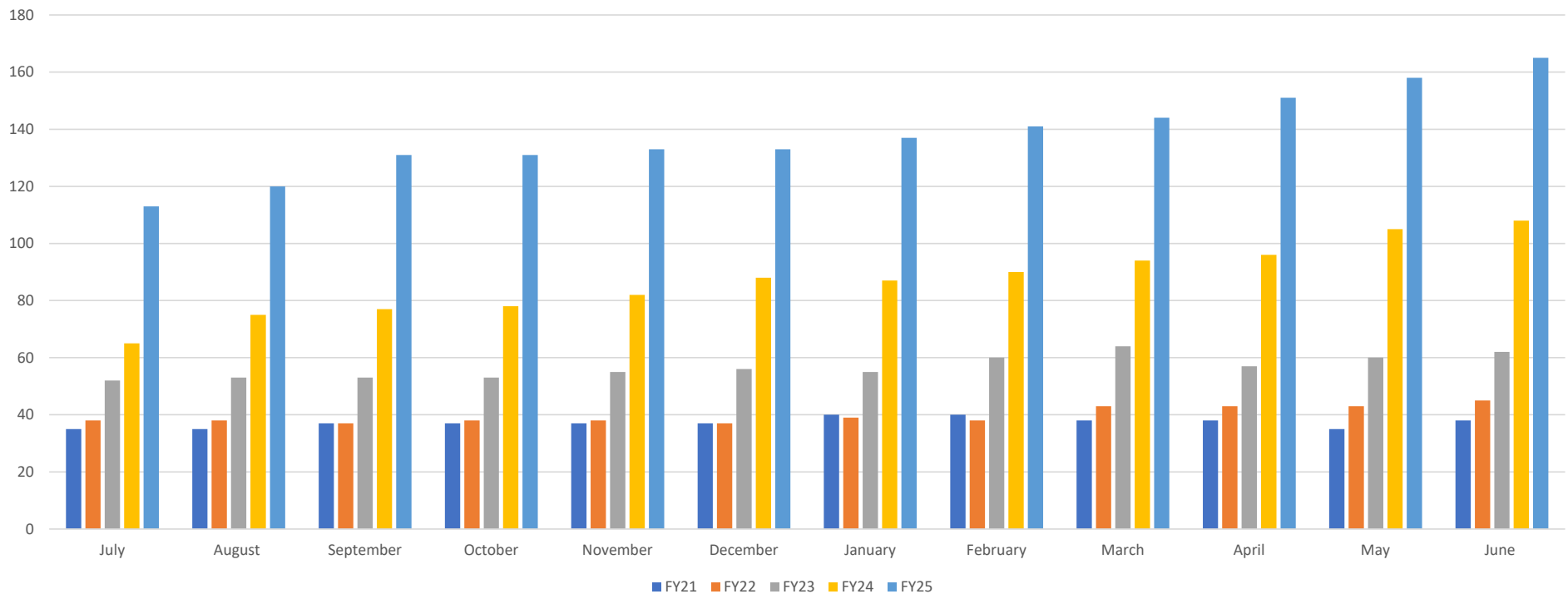


Special Assistance In Home (SAIH)

- SAIH provides **income and support services** to individuals who would prefer to live at home.
- SAIH has the **same income, level of care and resource requirements as Special Assistance.**
- Adult Services case manager completes a **service assessment** to determine if applicant or beneficiary **can remain safely at home.**
