



What We Have Heard

- Without action, **the digital divide could become permanent**
- Residents **not being able to access Medicaid, medical appointments, apply for jobs, or secure housing**
- A general need for training among **senior citizens and immigrants**
- Concerns about residents not being prepared to identify and **falling prey to scams**
- **Concerns about internet costs**, especially without the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)
- Internet access in **rural areas is challenging**
- **Homeless residents** not being able to take advantage of programs without access
- Concerns over how family households connect once they lose access to **public school-funded device**

Implementation



- **Set clear goals** for implementation phase

- Support, grow, and **promote successful existing digital inclusion programs** in training, device lending, and more
- Adopt mechanisms to **ensure the plan is regularly evaluated** and updated
