



Wake County Supported Strategies - CEP & USB

Community Eligibility Program (CEP)

- Wake County provides supplemental reimbursement
- Wake County supports 5 of the 43 CEP schools with supplemental funding

Universal School Breakfast (USB)

- Five schools offering universal breakfast only for 2025 - 2026 school year
- All supported with Wake County funds

FY25 Total Meals - 350,984 meals

FY 25 Total Expenditures- \$263,441.50

Wake County Supported Strategies - Pantries

School Food Pantries

- Wake County Currently supports 21 pantries
- **56** Total pantries in WCPSS (2024-2025 survey data)

FY25 Total Meals for Wake Supported Pantries:

58,278 meals

FY26 Funding for Food Pantries - \$53,400.00

Toward Zero Waste-SHARE Program



A food recovery program by Toward Zero Waste with Wake County Public School System to capture wholesome leftovers from Child Nutrition Services and feed students, rather than landfills.

Toward Zero Waste-SHARE Program

March 2025

- MOA with WCPSS for pilot program for 1 year
- Funding Lonnie and Carol Poole Family Foundation
- Phase 1 program launched at 8 pilot elementary schools

July-September 2025

- Funding Poole Family Foundation and Community Donors
- Phase 2 Program launched at 10 schools (4 middle schools)
- 29 additional schools on "interested" list for future phases

Toward Zero Waste-SHARE Program

SHARE Process

- Students place unwanted, unopen allowed food items from their tray onto the SHARE Collection Cart during meals.
- 2 take items during meals as permitted by the school. Leftover items are transferred to the SHARE Fridge and Pantry Cart by the school's SHARE team.
- Students may access items throughout the day. Missed breakfast? Forgot to pack a snack? Check out the SHARE Fridge and Pantry Cart!





TZW - SHARE Program - Highlights

 First lunch at Millbrook Elem = 18 juices, 65 bags of carrots, 50 bags of apple slices, and 25 packages of graham crackers.

- A student at Poe Elem arrived late, missing breakfast. She was able to get a bag of apple slices and a juice carton from the SHARE Fridge.
- 41 food items donated per day/per school =
 7,380 items in one school year



County Support - TZW SHARE

Wake County Cooperative Extension Support

10 hours/week AmeriCorps VISTA for capacity building

Wake County Environmental Services - additional staff support

 Environmental Education Program Coordinator for program management of Phase 1 schools (8)

TZW-Compostable Tray Program

- Partnered with 9 WCPSS PTA groups to purchase compostable fiber trays
- Some schools also compost food scraps through a private compost hauler

 To date >465,000 trays have been diverted from the landfill
