
Wake County Health and Human Services operates GoWake Access Transportation which provided in FY24 approximately 193,401 trips annually to the following groups:

- SmartRide NE



GoWake Access Transportation


GoWake Access Service Zone

FTA Zero-Emission Transition Plan

In 2020, NC Governor Roy Cooper signed the Multi-State Medium- and Heavy-Duty Zero Emission Vehicle Memorandum of Understanding, supporting the electrification of government fleets, including buses, and committing to coordination with key partners.

North Carolina Department of Transportation, Board of Transportation approved Funding for 6 ZEV Fleet Transition Plan projects in 2023 and 2024, including GoWake.

NCDOT's Responsibilities:

- Prepare the Plan following the Plan Components for a Zero-Emission Fleet Transition Plan required by FTA zero-emission vehicle projects.
- Lead the administration of the planning process.
- Provide a preliminary draft of the Plan to GOWAKE for review and comments.

*At the conclusion of the review process, GoWake will seek final approval from the appropriate boards and/or staff for implementation.

Public Hearing – Community Transportation Grant

The Community Transportation Grant (CTP) is from the North Carolina Department of Transportation for Transportation in the rural areas of the County.

- CTP Grant funds are integral to the operation of GoWake Access
- CTP funds help pay for van replacements and administrative costs
- Holding a public hearing to allow citizen input is a requirement of the CTP grant
