RESOLUTION
Recognizing Operation Green Light for Veterans**

WHEREAS, the residents of Wake County have great respect, admiration, and the utmost gratitude for all of the men and women who have selflessly served our country and this community in the Armed forces; and

WHEREAS, the contributions and sacrifices of the men and women who served in the Armed Forces have been vital in maintaining the freedoms and way of life enjoyed by our citizens; and

WHEREAS, Wake County seeks to honor these individuals who have paid the high price for freedom by placing themselves in harm's way for the good of all; and

WHEREAS, Veterans continue to serve our community in veterans' service organizations, religious groups, civil service, and by functioning as County Veteran Service Officers in 29 states to help fellow former service members access more than \$137 billion in federal health, disability and compensation benefits each year; and

WHEREAS, approximately 200,000 service members transition to civilian communities each year, and those communities play an essential role in supporting their successful reintroduction to civilian life; and

WHEREAS, studies indicate that 44 – 72 percent of service members experience high levels of stress during transition from military to civilian life; and Active Military Service Members transitioning from military service are at a high risk for suicide during their first year after military service; and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties encourages all counties, parishes, and boroughs to recognize Operation Green Light for Veterans; and

WHEREAS, Wake County appreciates the sacrifices of our United States Military Personnel and believes specific recognition should be granted; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that in observance of Operation Green Light, Wake County encourages its citizens in patriotic tradition to recognize the importance of honoring all those who made immeasurable sacrifices to preserve freedom by displaying a green light in a window of their place of business or residence.
