- Identified Facility on 2nd
 Street
- BOC Approved Acquisition
- Building Purchased Closed on September 18th
- Launched Community Engagement Process

White Flag: Current Need

To maintain last year's capacity, we need 100 more men's drop-in beds.

White Flag Capacity Need

2023 White Flag Peak Night:

- 322 Men
- 111 Women
- 9 Families

Current White Flag Capacity

- Bryant Center & Healing Transitions Men: 200
- Edenton St UMC & Healing Transitions Women: 175
- Salvation Army Families: 20


Healing Transitions: Capacity Update

- Right sizing men's shelter in preparation for January 2025 opening
- By-name list for capacity reduction
- SWSC and nonprofit partner referrals and placements



White Flag: Wake County Response

- Participation in by-name list referral process
- Continued support to temporary Bryant Center dropin shelter
- Utilization of the permanent 2nd Street drop-in shelter facility



King's Ridge: Opening Update

- CO expected in mid-December
- RHA releasing project-based voucher RFP in November
- City of Raleigh additional funds
- Wake County additional vouchers
