What is the community survey?

- A public opinion poll that:
 - Identifies a community's most important issues,
 - Informs policies and decision-making, and
 - Supports the development of a strategic plan.

What is the community survey?

Satisfaction Surveys

Individual, direct use, and experience shape opinions.

Perception Surveys

- Opinions based on observation
- May include direct use—but also:
 - Observation and feeling
 - Awareness and attitudes
 - Experiences by others (family, friends, co-workers, social networks)
 - Personal beliefs
 - Political beliefs
 - National and regional politics
 - Media and messaging








Representative of Geography




Representative of Income & Education Level

Years of Residency in Wake County




When Interpreting the Results...

- Respondents may not understand local government roles or differences (i.e., county vs. municipal services)
- Probolsky's methodology relied on social media and panels.
- Results:
 - Are summarized into Agree, Disagree, or Unsure
 - Compares the delta between Agree and Disagree
- Use caution when comparing to customer satisfaction survey results.

87% agree Wake County is a nice place to live


Question 46: Agree or disagree: Wake County is a nice place to live.




Reasons for Living in Wake County

 Location, proximity to friends and family and access to employment are the most common reasons.


 No other reason(s) exceeded 10%



84% agree the decisions by Wake County government impact their daily life




Where do you get your news and info?




Most important issues facing Wake County

- Wake County does not have complete control to impact these issues alone—requires partnerships




What should be Wake County's top priorities?


- Choose all that apply from a list of issues identified in other community engagements

- Top six responses mirror the top six from categories from openended question.




