Action

Begins

½ Cent sales tax

GoTriangle adopted a resolution to levy the tax

• GoTriangle notified the NC Dept. of Revenue

April 2017

\$7 County vehicle registration fee

- Wake County adopted a resolution to levy the tax
- Raleigh, Cary, Wake Forest, Durham, GoTriangle and Wake County adopted ILA to direct \$7 tax to GoTriangle
- Wake County notified NC DMV

Mailed July 2017

\$3 Increase to regional vehicle registration

- GoTriangle to adopt resolution in February to increase fee
- GoTriangle & Wake County notify the NC DMV

Mailed July 2017

Governance | Interlocal Agreement Highlights



Purpose

To provide a plan of governance for efficient implementation of the Wake Transit Plan

Parties

Wake County, CAMPO & GoTriangle

Designates High Level Decision Makers

CAMPO & GoTriangle

Establishes "Staff Level" Work Group

Transit Planning Advisory Committee

Project Implementation

Defines the process for developing detailed capital and operating plans; and project level agreements

Reporting

Defines the process for reporting of project revenues and expenditures

Governance | Transit Planning Advisory Committee



Transit Planning Advisory Committee **(TPAC)** is the technical team charged with planning and implementing the adopted Wake Transit Plan.

TPAC makes recommendations on how the dollars are spent.

Prepare Annual and Multi-Year Capital and Operating Plans.

Recommendations are sent to the governing boards simultaneously for approval.

Governance | Decision Making & Implementation



TPAC

Develops the recommended Annual Transit Work Plan including capital and operating plans

GoTriangle & CAMPO

Makes all approvals for Annual Transit Work Plan capital and operating

Implementation

Executed through project level agreements for construction, deployment and operations

- All steps include public input and feedback
- Wake County BOC facilitates a committee to resolve differences between CAMPO and GoTriangle

Governance | Implementation Agreements



Long Term Agreement

Master Participation Agreement (March 2017)

- \$7 Vehicle registration to the overall transit efforts
- Overarching agreement for any party wishing to participate in use of Wake Transit Tax proceeds
- Agreement addressing rules of engagement for Wake Transit Implementation activities
- All Wake municipalities invited as signing parties

5 Year Operating Program

Master Implementation Agreement

- Agreement addressing logical grouping of projects that drill down to programmatic provisions
- Signatories are specific project implementers and GoTriangle as Tax District Administrator

Annual

Annual Capital/Operating Funding Agreements

- Legal authorization of funding for projects for specified annual or biennial period
- Specifies deliverables and reporting milestones
