SUBJECT:	Per-Pupil Calculation Approach

The County Manager's Recommended Fiscal Year 2018 Budget includes a total operating appropriation of \$425,911,000 for the Wake County Public School System. In the Recommended Budget book and the County Manager's presentation, it is noted that this equates to per-pupil funding of \$2,633. This is calculated by dividing the total appropriation of \$425,911,000 by the total projected 2017-18 membership for WCPSS of 161,757. The projected enrollment of 161,757 does not include charter school students. This method of calculating per-pupil funding is not new, but mirrors county per-pupil calculations shared with the school system and the public in budget documents and presentations in prior fiscal years.

The North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (DPI) does not include charter school enrollment in its per-pupil calculations for Local Education Agencies (LEAs). DPI uses Average Daily Membership (ADM) as its basis for calculating per-pupil information.

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Pupil Accounting Definitions

North Carolina uses the final Average Daily Membership (ADM) figure as our base for calculating perpupil information. The National average uses the Average Daily Attendance (ADA) figure as their base. The ADA figure typically will be lower than an ADM figure; thus the National per-pupil figures may be higher as a result.

The ADM for WCPSS does not include charter schools. Charter schools are treated separately by DPI. Each charter school has its own ADM and its own per-pupil calculations. The following reflects the per-pupil information for charters in Wake County.

When DPI compares per-pupil funding between LEAs, charter school enrollment is not included. Instead, charters are treated separately as shown above. The DPI chart below compares the FY2016 county appropriation to WCPSS to other LEAs on a per-pupil basis. When the total appropriation of \$384,849,031 is divided by the \$2,457 per-pupil amount, the result is 156,634. This is close to the Final 2015-16 WCPSS Average Daily Membership (ADM) of 156,612, which does not factor in charter school enrollment. According to WCPSS, the charter roster count for September of the 2015-16 school year was 9,577. If DPI added charter school enrollment of 9,577 to the 156,634, the combined enrollment would be 166,211, and per-pupil funding would be \$2,315.

The total county appropriation for FY 16 was 386,000,000. The \$384,849,031 below excludes \$1,150,969 for capital outlay, as this compares only current expense funding. The \$384,849,031 does include planned funding for WCPSS payments to charter schools, which totaled \$21,416,563 in the FY16 Amended Budget.

County Funding for Charter Schools

The county recognizes the school system is financially responsible for the growing number of Wake County students attending charter schools. Each year in the county's final budget ordinance, there is an allocation to WCPSS for payments to charter schools. This allocation totals \$25,416,536 in the current year budget. In materials shared with the Board of Commissioners at its April 10, 2017 work session, the county included the anticipated increase in charter school payments in the list of WCPSS requested increases for which the county is responsible. That list totaled \$12 million, including \$6.8 million for charter schools. The County Manager's Recommended Budget includes a total increase of \$16 million for WCPSS.
