Reprogramming Federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds

On October 16, 2017 the Wake County Division of Housing and Community Revitalization will ask the Wake County Board of Commissioners to amend the FY 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan and the FY 2016-2017 Action Plan.

Up to \$166,947 in FY 2016-2017 uncommitted revolving loan funds from the CDBG grant will be reprogrammed to renovate an interior portion of the Crosby Garfield Center at 568 E. Lenoir Street, Raleigh, NC. The space will be used for a variety of social and economic vitality programs to help low income individuals and families including counseling, leadership development and programs for youth.

Up to \$180,000 in FY 2016-2017 public facilities funds for the construction of the Garner Recreation Center will be reprogrammed to public services funds for the purchase of equipment for recreational activities at the Garner Recreation Center, located at the corner of Main and Montague Streets in Garner, NC. The Recreation Center is in a predominantly low income neighborhood in Garner, and will offer athletic opportunities, after school programs, summer camps and cultural activities for residents within that area.

The public may comment on the proposed reprogramming from September 12, 2017 through October 13, 2017. The Wake County Board of Commissioners will vote on the amendments at their regularly scheduled meeting at 2:00 pm on October 16, 2017 in room 2700 of the Wake County Justice Center, 301 S. McDowell St., Raleigh, NC.
