HOUSING AND COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION FUND PROJECT ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Wake County, North Carolina, that pursuant to section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following project ordinance is hereby adopted:

Section 1: Projects are authorized as described in sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, and involve a variety of affordable housing activities, including Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS Program (HOPWA), funded from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and other County and grant supported affordable housing initiatives.

Section 2: CDBG PROGRAM. (A) REVENUES. It is estimated that the following revenues will be available to complete projects in the CDBG Program:

Section 8: FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING AND REPORTING. (A) The Finance Department is hereby directed to maintain, within the Housing and Community Revitalization Fund, sufficient specific detailed accounting records for each grant or project authorized. (B) The Finance Director is directed to report annually on the financial status of each grant and the revenue received.

Section 9: APPROPRIATIONS AUTHORITY. Upon its adoption, this Housing and Community Revitalization Project Ordinance will become part of a multi-year special revenue fund for affordable housing

projects, which include CDBG, HOME, and HOPWA grants, State and County affordable housing programs funded in previous years. All funds are appropriated pursuant to section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina; therefore, appropriations do not lapse at the end of the fiscal year and are available for duration of the project unless subsequently amended by Board action.

Section 10: APPROPRIATIONS TRANSFER AUTHORITY. The County Manager is authorized to transfer appropriations between projects within the Housing and Community Revitalization Fund.

Section 11: Copies of this ordinance shall be filed with the County Manager and Finance Director.
