**Item Title:** Interlocal Agreement Between the Town of Rolesville and Wake County Regarding Administration of Rolesville's Stormwater Ordinance and Erosion and Sedimentation Control Ordinance

## Specific Action Requested:

That the Board of Commissioners authorizes the County Manager to execute an Interlocal Agreement between the Town of Rolesville and Wake County regarding the County's administration of Rolesville's Stormwater Ordinance and Erosion and Sedimentation Control Ordinance

## Item Summary:

- Purpose: The Board of Commissioners approves interlocal agreements for the provision of services by Wake County.
- Background: On January 13, 2010 Wake County and the Town of Rolesville entered into an interlocal agreement regarding the County's administration of Rolesville's Stormwater Ordinance and Erosion and Sedimentation Control Ordinance. This agreement expires on June 30, 2018. The attached interlocal agreement provides for the continuation of services by Wake County for the next ten years from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2028.
- Board Goal: This agreement complements the Board's Economic Strength objective #3 of developing economic development tools and strategies that encourage environmental stewardship and return on investments that produce societal benefits.
- Fiscal Impact: There is no fiscal impact from this action. Under the agreement, Wake County collects fees from developers applying for stormwater and erosion and sedimentation control approval in accordance with the fee schedule approved by Board of Commissioners. The fees are retained by Wake County to pay for the cost of personnel, equipment, space and resources needed to administer the ordinances, and are reflected in the FY2019 budget.

## Additional Information:

The Town of Rolesville's governing board approved this interlocal agreement at their April 3, 2018 meeting. Rolesville's Mayor has executed two originals.
