The final outcome for the project will be an implementable plan that will address modal priorities and set the vision for how transit and multimodal transportation serves Downtown Raleigh.






What is Multi-modal?

A multimodal plan incorporates diverse transportation options, including walking, biking, driving, and public transit, and finds ways to create connections among those modes. It also takes into account on-street parking, loading, ADA accessibility, streetscape, livability, and much more. By accommodating all modes, this creates more travel choices in Downtown Raleigh.





Project Approach





Community engagement is a priority throughout the duration of the project.

#### STAKEHOLDER GROUPS

Provide input from the perspective of the community on tradeoffs and priorities, as well as give feedback on specific needs, desires, and concerns of each group.

#### **ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

Consists of representation from across the Downtown area, providing input on behalf of each organization and guiding decisions at key milestones throughout the project. Advisory Committee will vote on the preferred multi-modal scenario that will be further refined to develop final recommendation. Wake County is a member of the Advisory Committee.

#### **TECHNICAL TEAM**

Reviews project materials and provides oversight and direction throughout the project on behalf of each of their perspective departments or organizations.
