Pathway to Self-Sufficiency

INDIVIDUAL & COMMUNITY SELF-SUFFICIENCY

Community and economic development occur at the ground level. We invest in improving the community infrastructure but more importantly, we invest in community members. Our approach focuses on stability first and then removing personal and systemic barriers to self-improvement. By growing personal capacities, we improve communities without displacing residents and character.

WORKFORCE

For many-especially for those with a high school degree or less-the promise of Wake County's booming economy is out of reach. To help our clients succeed in Wake County's competitive job market, we provide in-demand skills trainings and soft-skills workshops. By working directly with local employers looking to hire, we identify careers for which the absence of a college degree or the presence of a criminal record are not automatic disqualifiers. Together we build curricula to prepare our clients for living-wage work.

HOUSING

Stable, safe, and affordable housing is necessary for individuals and families to feel secure and that security is what affords them the ability to focus on eliminating other barriers preventing self-sufficiency.

SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

We provide and/or connect our clients with additional resources that will help along their journey to self-sufficiency. Passage Home provides youth education and enrichment services for the children of our clients; those with an entrepreneurial spirit are connected to LaunchRaleigh, co-founded by Passage Home; and we collaborate with community partners that provide assistance outside of our scope.

CASE MANAGEMENT

Our individualized and comprehensive case management programs help clients acquire or locate reliable transportation, identify and secure quality child care, develop in-demand job skills, connect with addiction and/or mental health counselors, and whatever other services are necessary for success.

MICRO

Passage Home takes a micro approach to alleviating poverty, focusing on the specific needs of the individual and helping them overcome their barriers to housing security and livingwage employment

MACRO

Passage Home takes a macro approach to alleviating poverty, looking at what societal and community issues entrench our clients in the cycle of poverty. Our macro approach has led us to a larger community vision
