In 1994 Nina moved to the newly built Swinburne Building and in 2004 she began providing supervision to line staff who provided In-Home Services. In 2008 Nina became part of the Blended Team restructuring of Child Welfare and moved to the Northern Regional Center where she has remained.

Nina will retire on March 1 after 30 years of service to Wake County. Her retirement plans include traveling, bicycling and continuing to support various missions and social groups promoting racial and social equality.
