

WAKE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS RESOLUTION Honoring the 100th Anniversary of the American Legion

WHEREAS, the American Legion was chartered by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veterans' organization, focusing on service to veterans, service members and their communities; and

WHEREAS, the Legion evolved from a group of war-weary veterans of World War I into one of the most influential nonprofit groups in the United States. Today, membership stands at more than 2 million in more than 13,000 posts worldwide; and

WHEREAS, local American Legion programs strengthen the nation one community at a time. American Legion Baseball and the Operation Comfort Warriors program are great examples. The Legion also raises millions of dollars to help veterans and their families during times of need; and

WHEREAS, The American Legion is a nonpartisan, not-for-profit organization that stands behind the issues most important to the nation's veterans. Legionnaires' sense of obligation to community, state and nation drives an honest advocacy for veterans in Washington; and

WHEREAS, there are more than 2,000 registered members within Wake County and 13 active American Legion posts; and

WHEREAS, there are more than 50,000 veterans within the County limits and even more who reside outside the limits but work and attend school inside Wake County's jurisdiction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wake County Board of Commissioners celebrates and honors the American Legion on its 100th anniversary.
