

## WAKE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS PROCLAMATION Recognizing May as National Foster Care Month

**WHEREAS**, in Wake County there are over 563 children and youth in foster care, 64 of which are young adults in extended foster care, being provided with a safe, secure and stable home along with the compassion and nurturing of a family; and

**WHEREAS**, foster families play a vital role in helping children and families in crisis by serving as a bridge to help families heal and reconnect; and

**WHEREAS**, the youth will receive services that place value on maintaining healthy connections with their family of origin and community; and

**WHEREAS**, every effort is made to place children in safe homes within their community of origin and one that is also reflective of that youth; and

**WHEREAS**, there are numerous individuals, public, and private organizations who work to increase public awareness of the needs of children in, and leaving foster care.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Wake County Board of Commissioners, does hereby proclaim May 2019, as "National Foster Care Month" in Wake County.
