III. NC-540 Southeast Extension

The proposed Complete 540 project, also known as the Southeast Extension, would extend the Triangle Expressway from the N.C. 55 Bypass in Apex to U.S. 64/U.S. 264 (I-495) in Knightdale, completing the 540 Outer Loop around the greater Raleigh area.

Transportation, social and economic demands and mobility considerations are the basis for additional transportation infrastructure in southeastern Wake County. The Complete

540 project would link Apex, Cary, Clayton, Garner, Fuquay-Varina, Holly Springs and Raleigh. NC Turnpike staff brief Commissioners on the project.

Since 2012, the County has used a Request for Proposals (RFP) process that targeted specific landowners and solicited their interest in selling their land as open space. In addition to open space properties, staff has also offered local municipalities a chance to submit greenway projects for funding. This process has been well received by the community, municipalities and non-profits that have participated.

Staff expect to continue using this process to determine the allocation of open space and greenway funds from the 2018 Parks, Greenways and Open Space Bond. Staff will present an overview of the history of the program and welcome the committee's feedback on the future direction of the process.
