This transition to managed care is the most significant change ever undertaken by NC Medicaid and will impact approximately 2.1 million people statewide. In Wake County, approximately 143,500 will be impacted. This briefing will cover the steps taken in preparation of this transition from a fee-for-service structure to a managed care service as well as some of the potential impacts.
