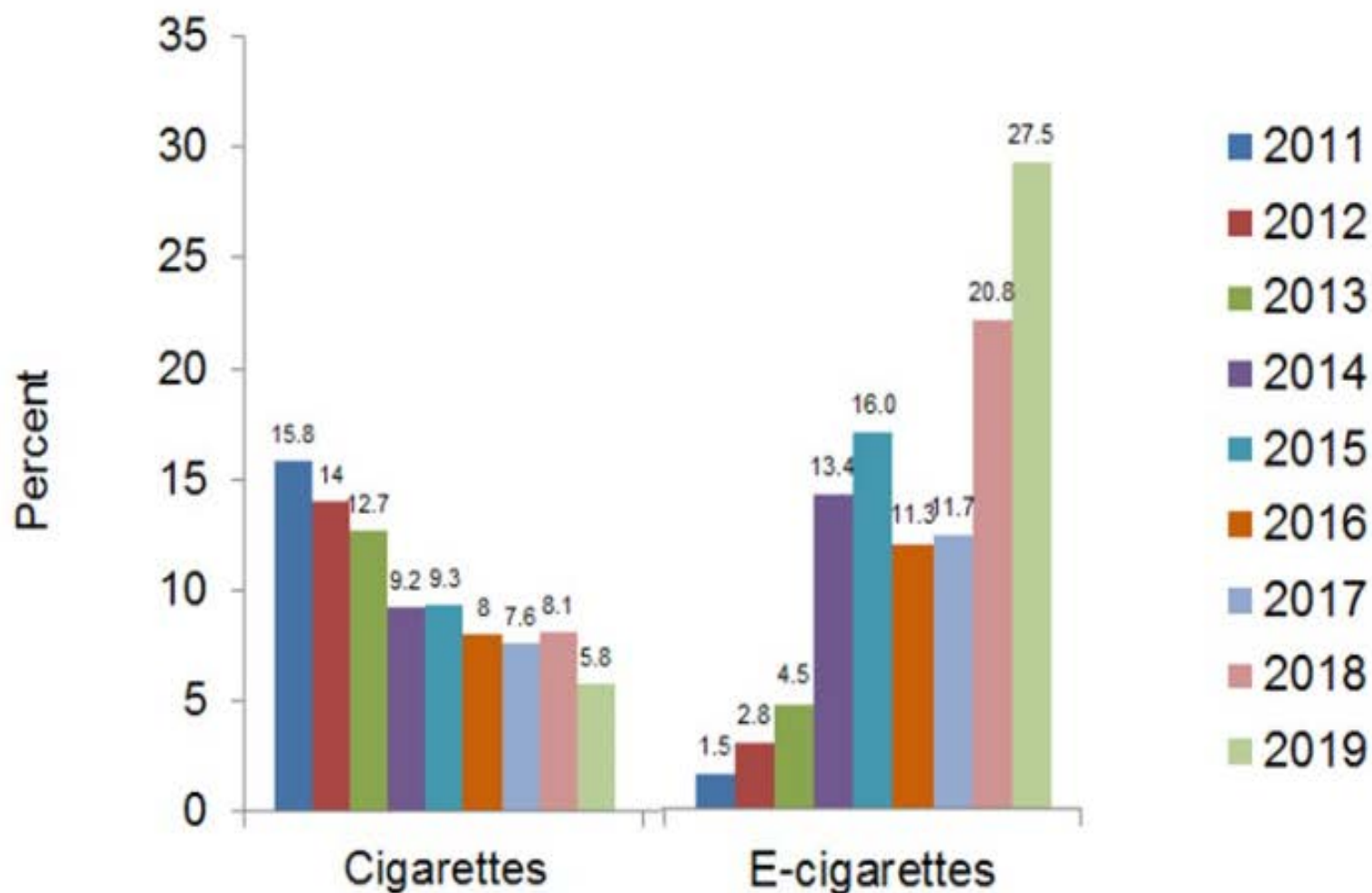
What the Data Shows

- Vaping rates among teens continue to increase.
- Vaping rates among adults remain low.
- Smoking rates among adults and youth continue to decline.

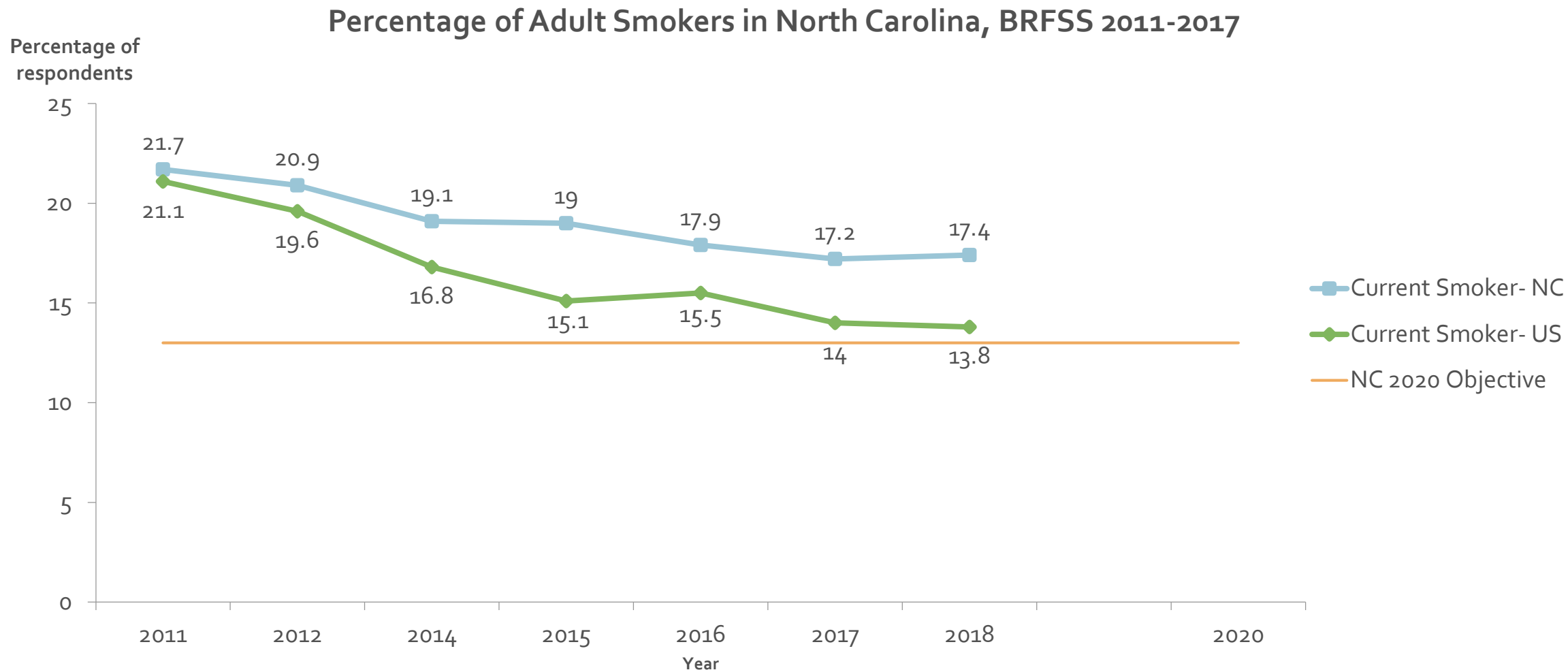

North Carolina Smoking Prevalence

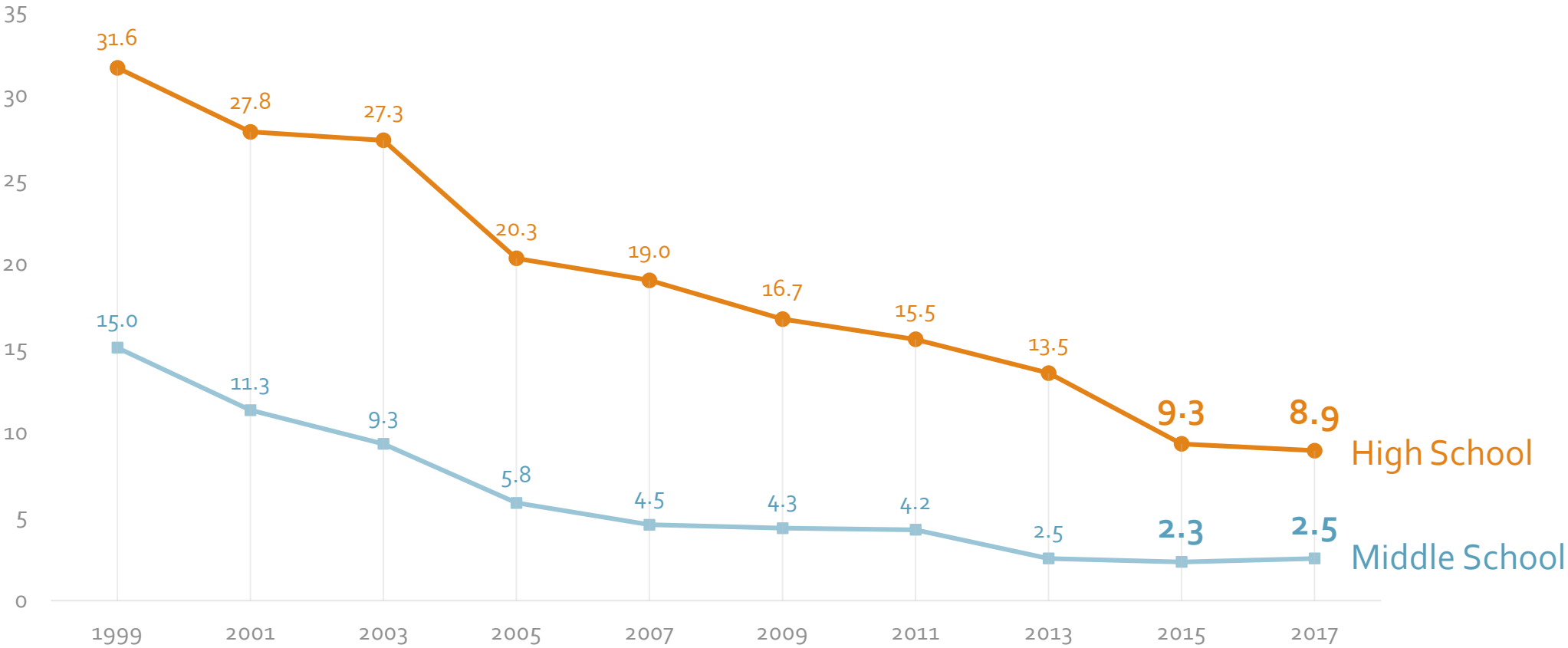

Under Consideration to Address Vaping

The Wake County Human Services Director and the Wake County Human Services' Board are reviewing options for action:

- Board of Health Rule prohibiting vaping in public places (includes all municipalities with no opt-out option)

OR

- Recommendation to the Board of Commissioners prohibiting vaping in public places (only includes unincorporated areas of the county)

AND/OR

- Resolution supporting the reversal of preemption, giving county/municipality local control

Most Recent Efforts
