**Permanent, supportive housing** affords families security and the ability to focus on longer-term goals

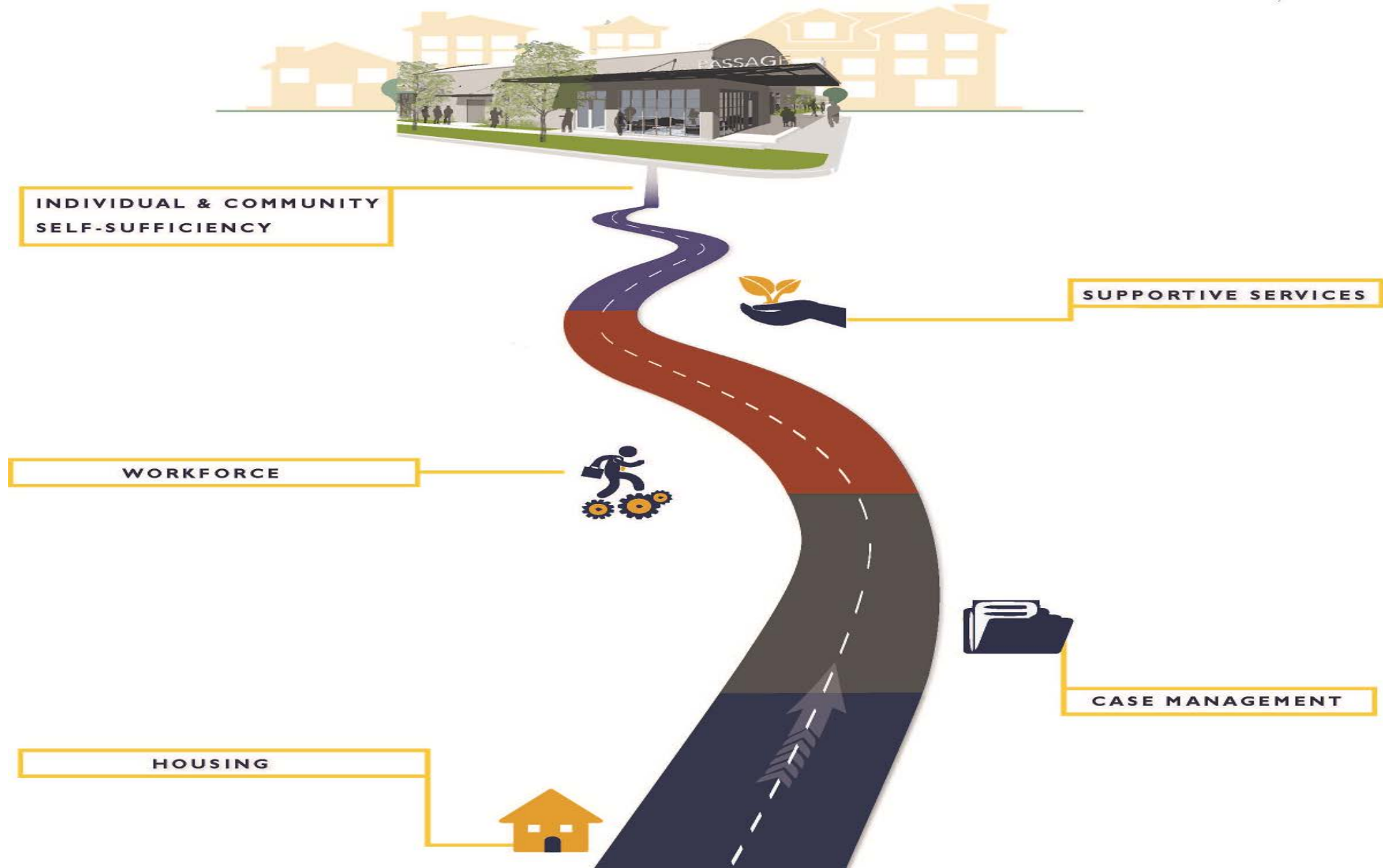


**Comprehensive case management** focuses on removing barriers to living wage employment
