# Interim Operations Plan

## Wake County Sheriff's Office

- Schedule & oversee law enforcement agencies
- Conduct law enforcement training exercises
- Manage schedule within allocated hours

## N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission (WRC)

- Manage, operate and schedule public use of the range (non-law enforcement)
- Manage schedule within allocated hours

# Agreement: Wildlife Resources Commission

- County provides in-kind use of the facility to WRC
- WRC plans to provide recreational public use of the range at no cost to the public, but may charge reasonable fees in the future
- Proposed date to reopen to the public is March 15, 2020
- Initial agreement will be up to 12 months

# Next Steps

- Complete and execute law enforcement use agreements
  - Wake County Sherriff's Office
  - Law Enforcement Agencies
- Firearms Education and Training Center reopens to the public  
March 15, 2020
- Continue process to retain consultant services July 1, 2020
