

PROPOSAL

The culminating efforts of equitable economic development and inclusive prosperity continues to evolve. This work, combined with a growing public desire to address root causes of racial disparities, has led us to an opportunity to convene a public-private initiative.

To continue to advance the work of inclusive prosperity and address systemic racism, RTI was solicited to create a Blueprint to set the foundation for a dynamic 10-year strategy.

- The Blueprint will build off existing research and recent community planning efforts that effectively capture the needs and priorities in Wake County.
- This effort will help transition this information into an action-oriented Blueprint.
- An online, publicly available dashboard to help track progress toward the longer-term goal of ending systemic racism will accompany the Blueprint.
