## Campaign Goal

- 1. Add 200 beds
- 2. Increase bathroom/shower, laundry, dining, classroom, kitchen capacity
- 3. Continue providing services on demand

\*Campaign costs include 4% owner contingency, marketing, staffing, events, and consultants

### Since February 2018

- Men's construction costs increased 39%
- Men's design/engineering estimates increased 25%
- Women's construction costs increased 39% overall (51% increase of annex and 27% increase for shelter and main building)
- Women's design/engineering estimates increased 14%

#### **Project Timeline**

- Construction scheduled to begin:
  - o January 2021 at Women's Campus
  - o Early 2021 at Men's Campus

#### Wake County Support

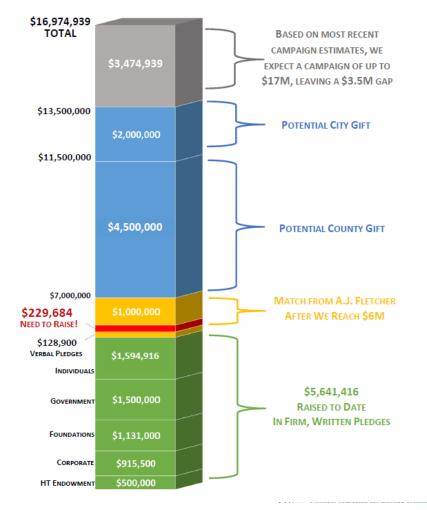
Healing Transitions is asking for an additional \$4.5 million from Wake County for a total of \$6 million in support for the Capital Campaign.

## **Current County Support and Overall Progress**

- Current pledges/payments \$5.6M
  - Wake County commitment \$1,500,000 (\$500,000 Capital Improvement Grant & \$1,000,000 Women's)
- Getting to \$6 million gets us to \$7 million
