### I. Expanding Rail in North Carolina: The S-Line Opportunity

NCDOT staff will review current plans and opportunities, highlighting their potential impact on Wake County. NCDOT will request that Wake County invest \$75,000 in a new planning effort. The Board of Commissioners will receive the briefing, ask questions, and provide guidance to staff about the investment request.
