In 2017, as a part of its management plan, the RDUAA released a Land Lease Request for Proposals which covered both the Odd-Fellows and "286" tracts. The County was the only submitter for the "286" tract. The Wake Board of Commissioners, at their October 2, 2017 meeting authorized staff to proceed forward with negotiations for the lease of the "286" tract by the County. Since that time the County put on hold further negotiations for the lease of the "286" tract until various legal issues were resolved.

**III. Comprehensive/Integrated Stormwater Management Plan**

The County has the opportunity to evaluate stormwater at a watershed scale that crosses individual project and jurisdictional boundaries. By focusing at the watershed scale, the County and partners will be better positioned to collaboratively address stormwater issues at the source rather than limiting response to site specific impacts that reflect symptoms of larger issues. The first step in this process will be to document existing data and stormwater management capabilities of individual municipalities with the support of online mapping tools. Identifying existing stormwater data and capacity gaps will inform the development of recommendations and strategies for a more holistic approach to stormwater management. This approach is consistent with the One Water Initiative in that all water, regardless of its source, should be managed in a manner that is comprehensive and sustainable.
