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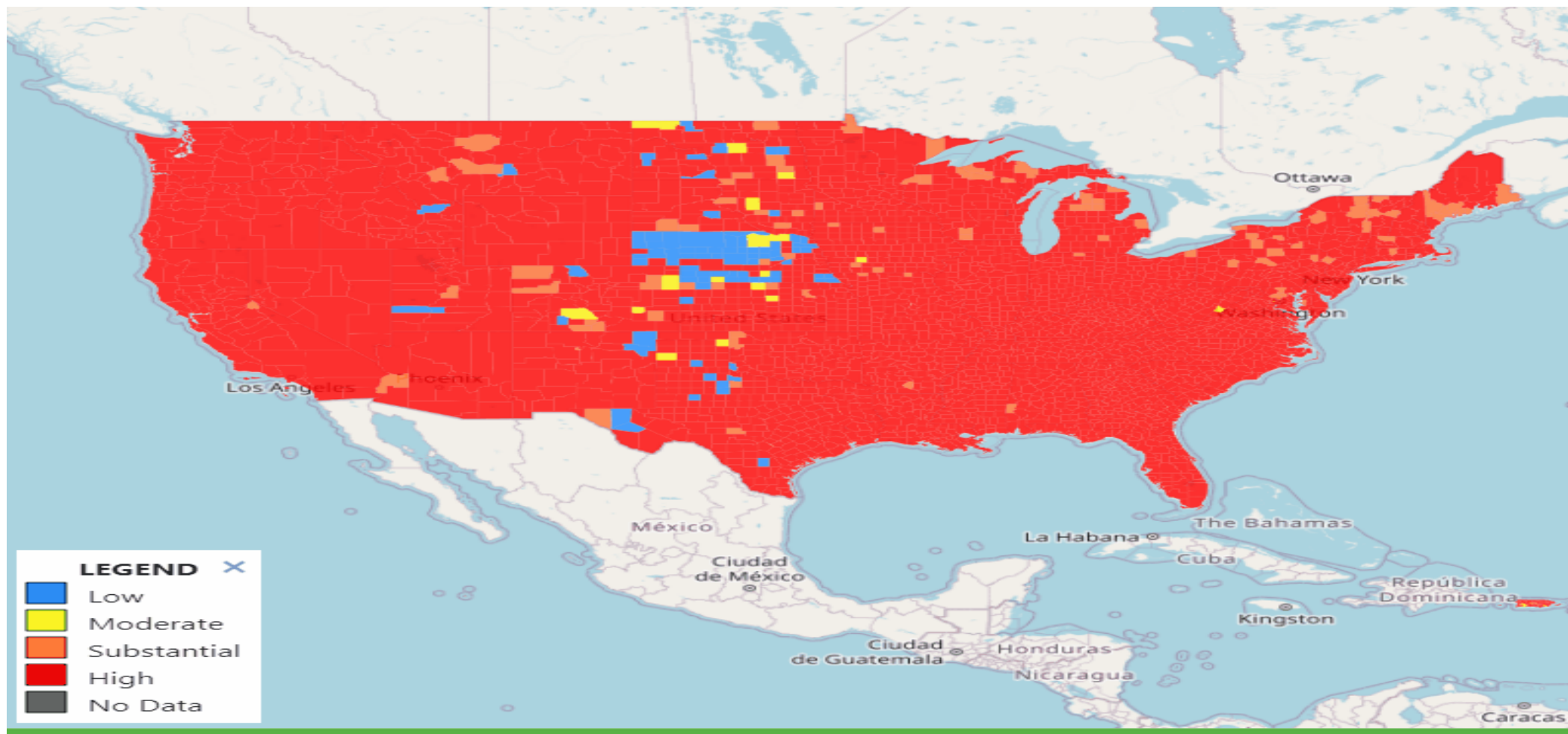

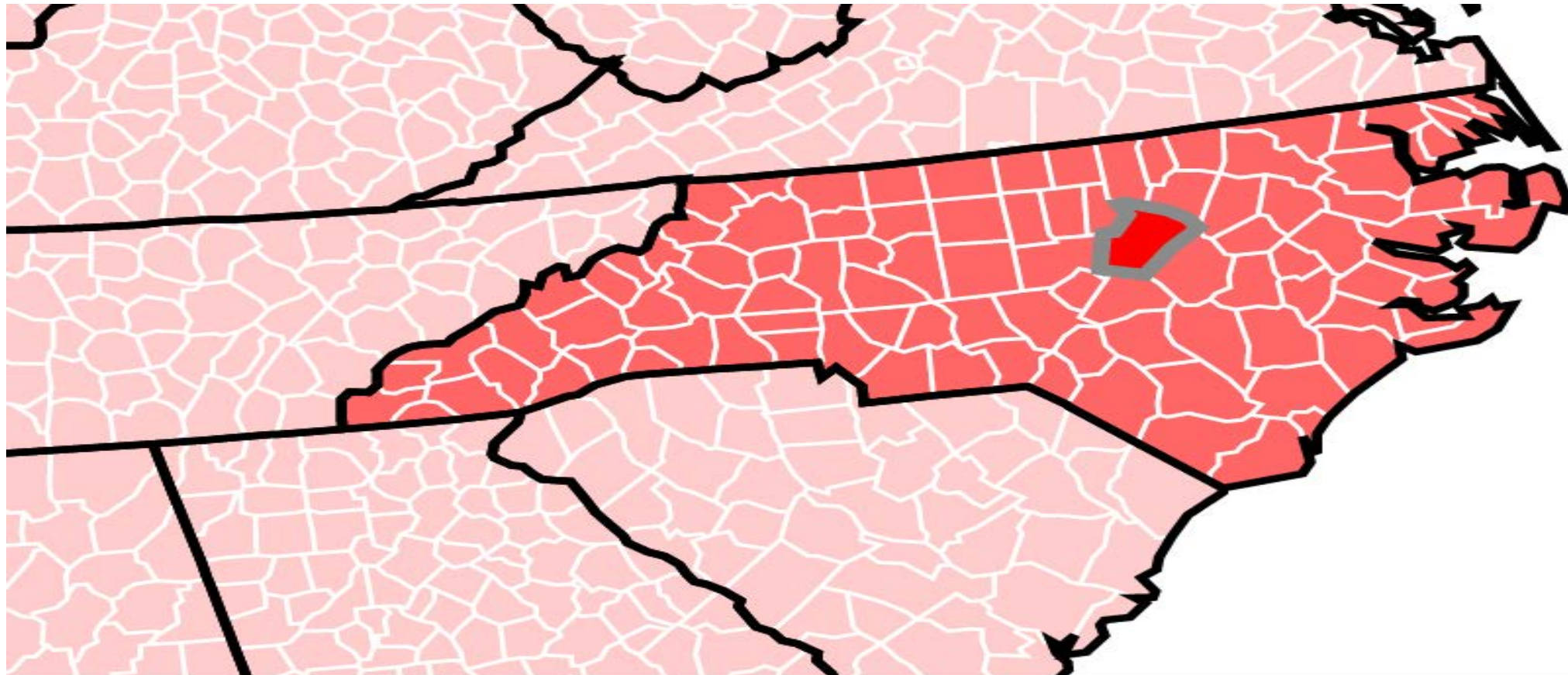

COVID-19 Spread, All US Counties, 8/26/21-9/27/21



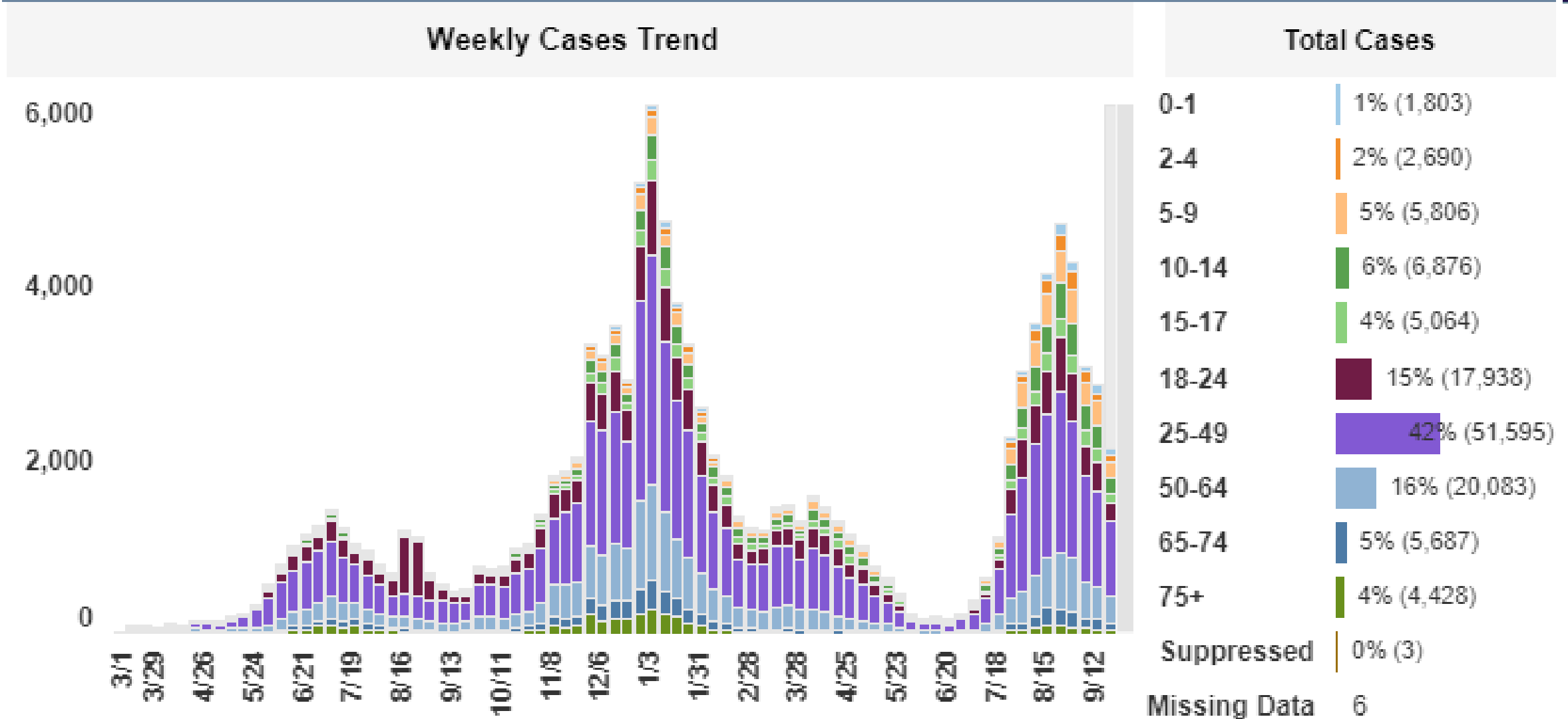
COVID-19 | PHASED PREVENTION | LEVELS OF COMMUNITY TRANSMISSION |

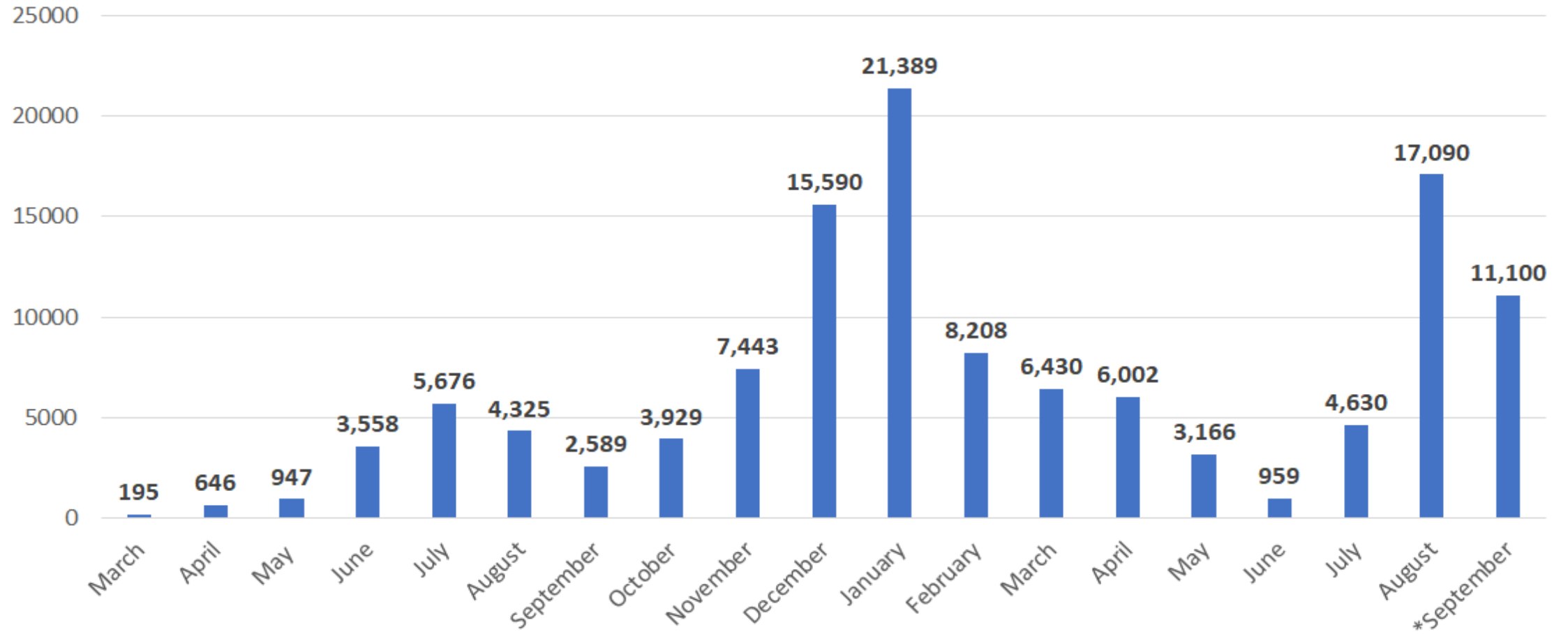

Wake County Cases by Age

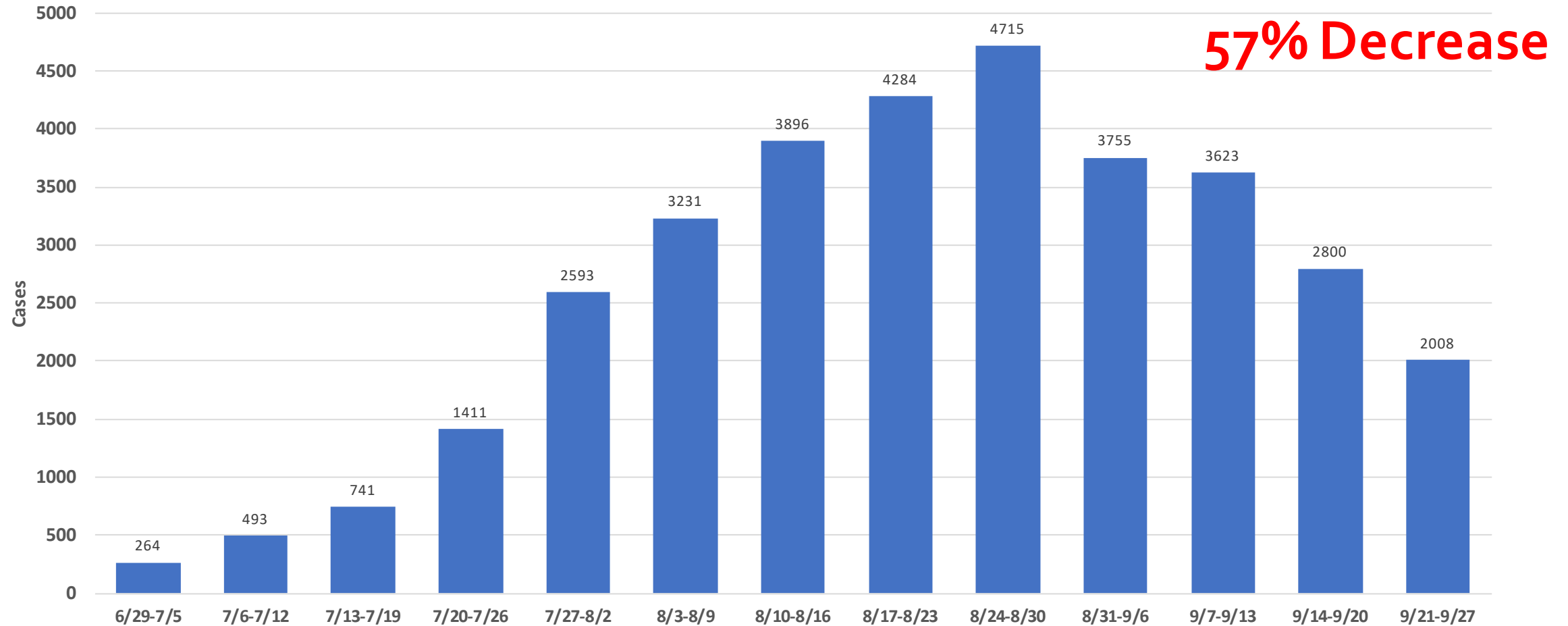


Wake County COVID-19 Cases by Month

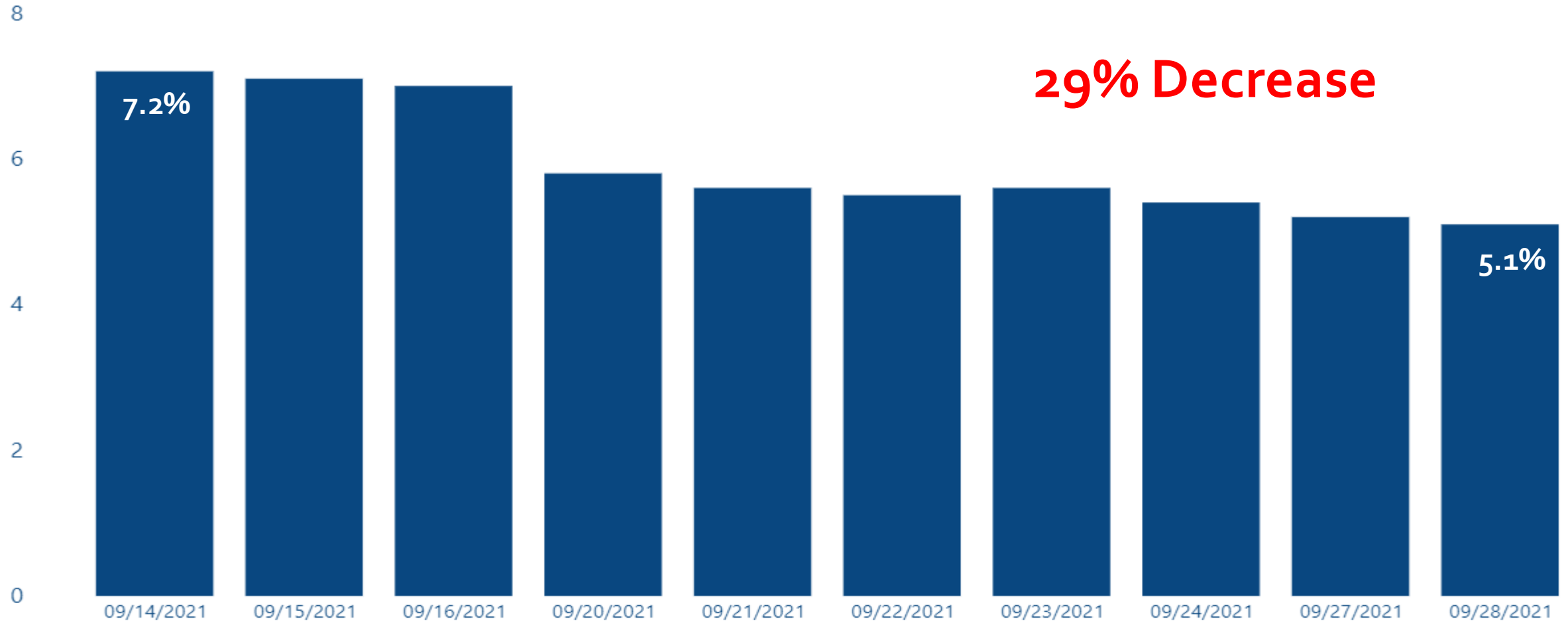

Wake County COVID-19 Cases by Week

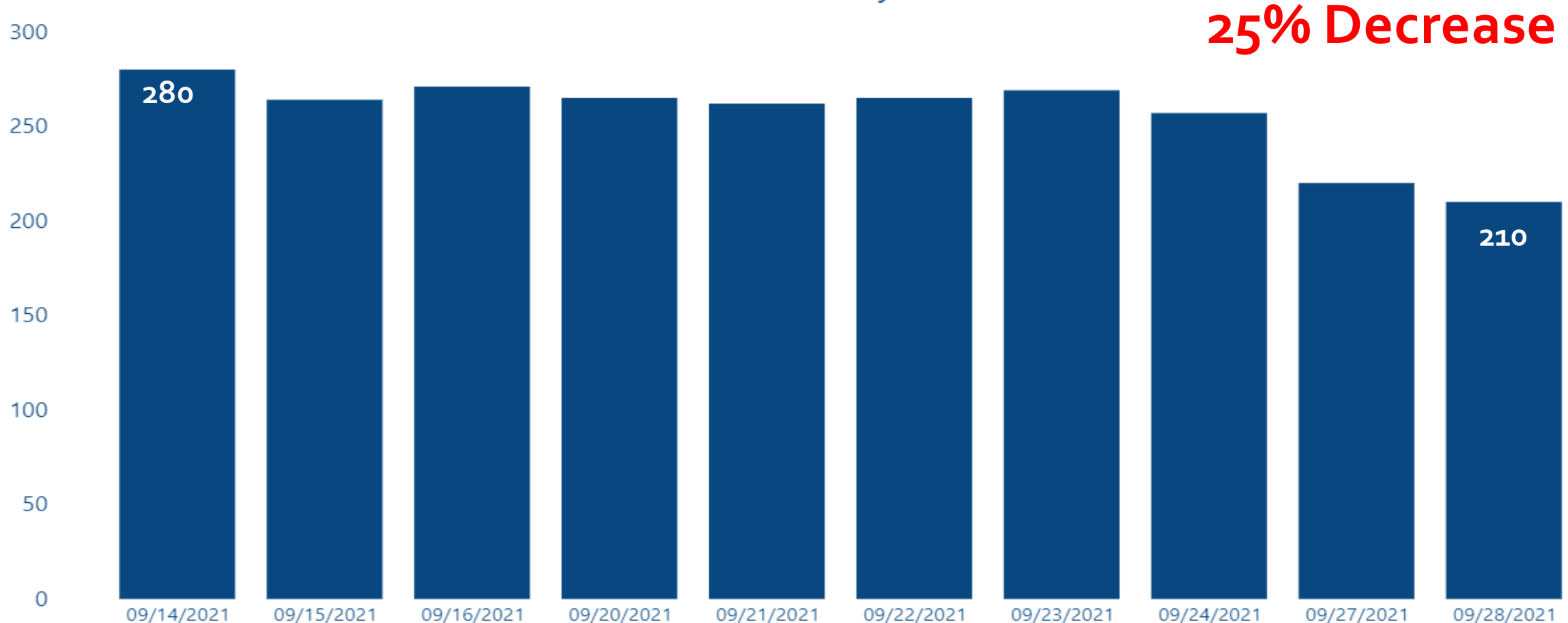


Wake County Percent Positivity 9/14-9/28

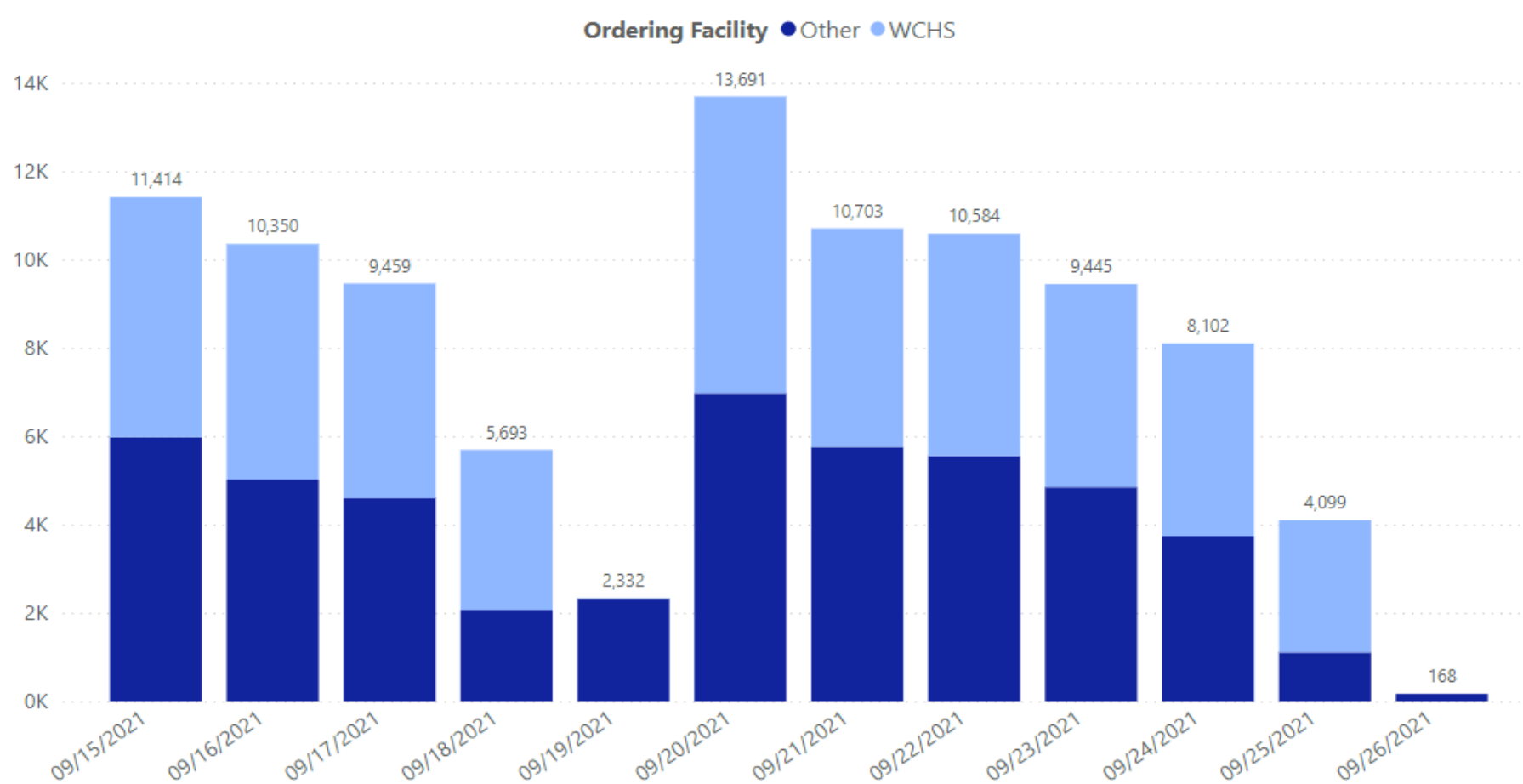


Wake County Hospitalizations 9/14-9/28

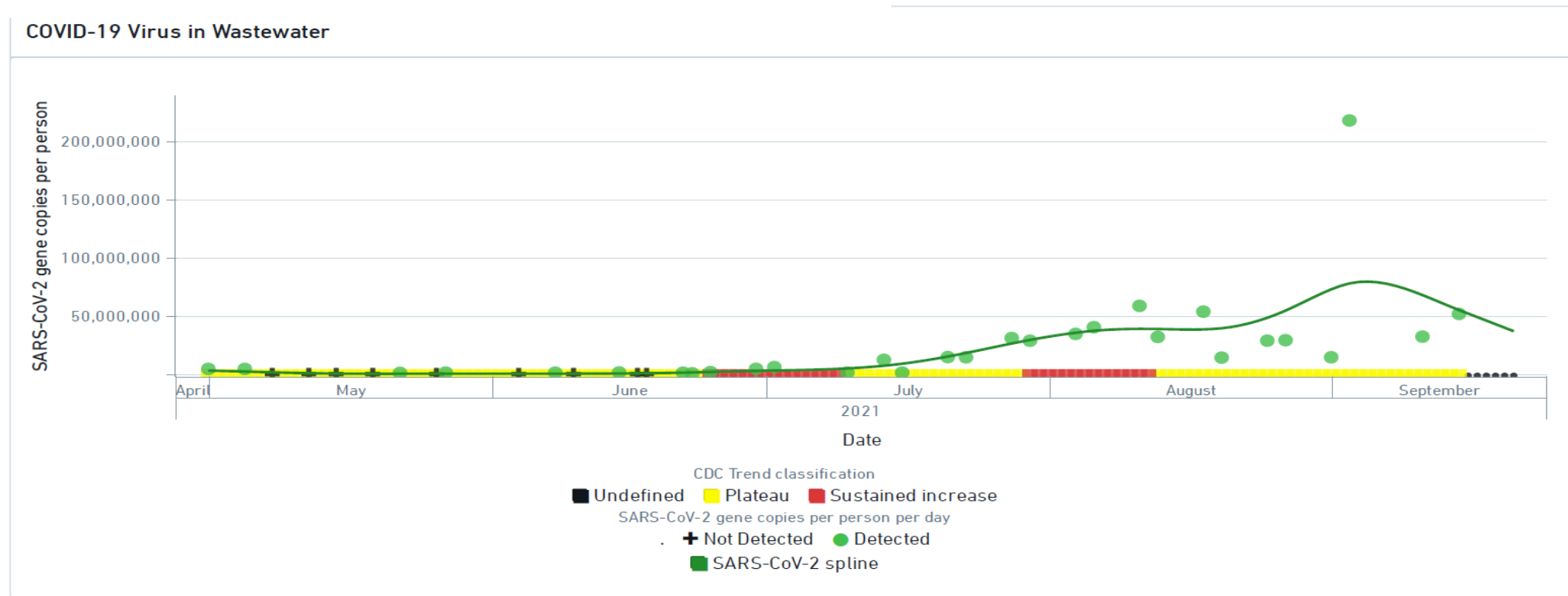

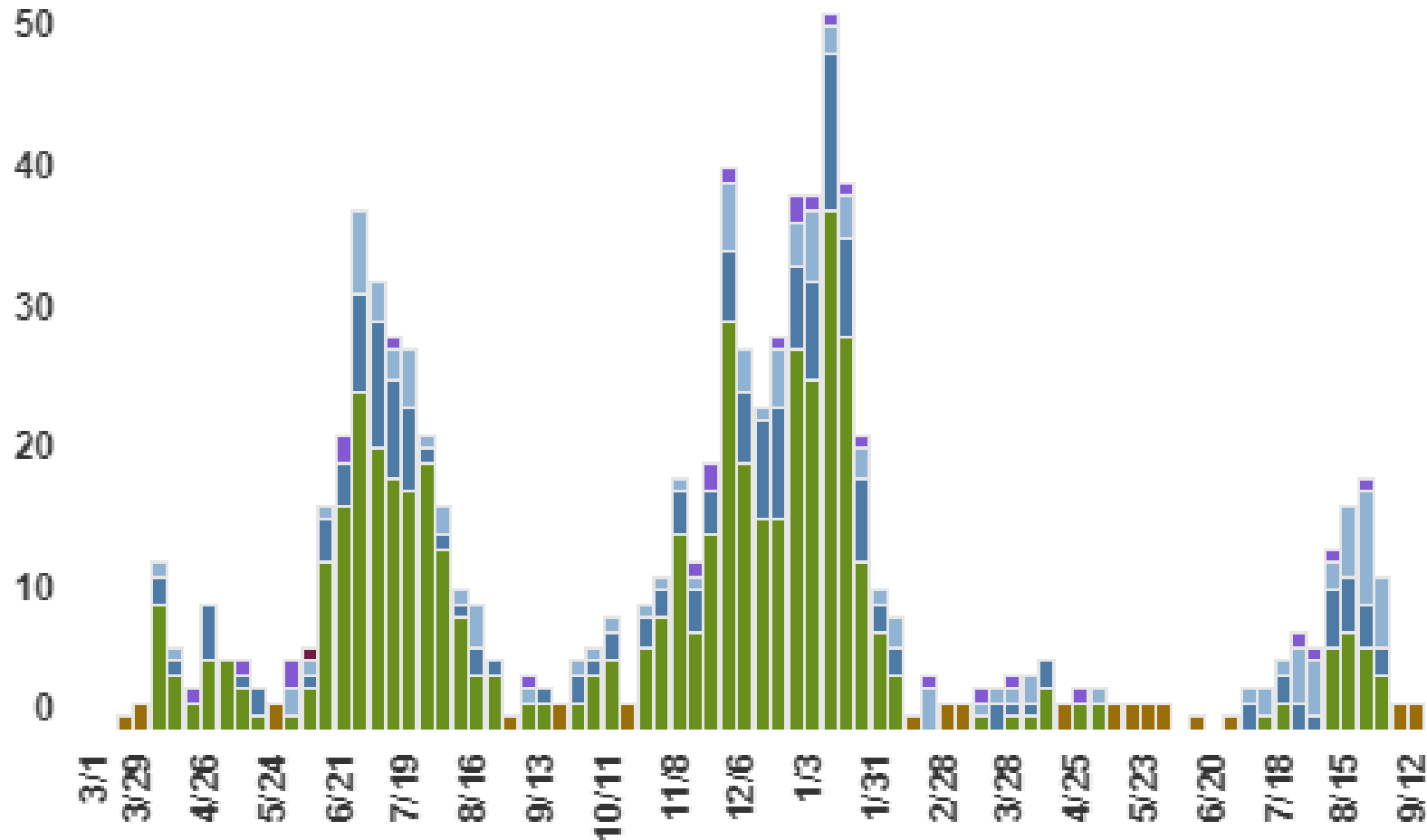

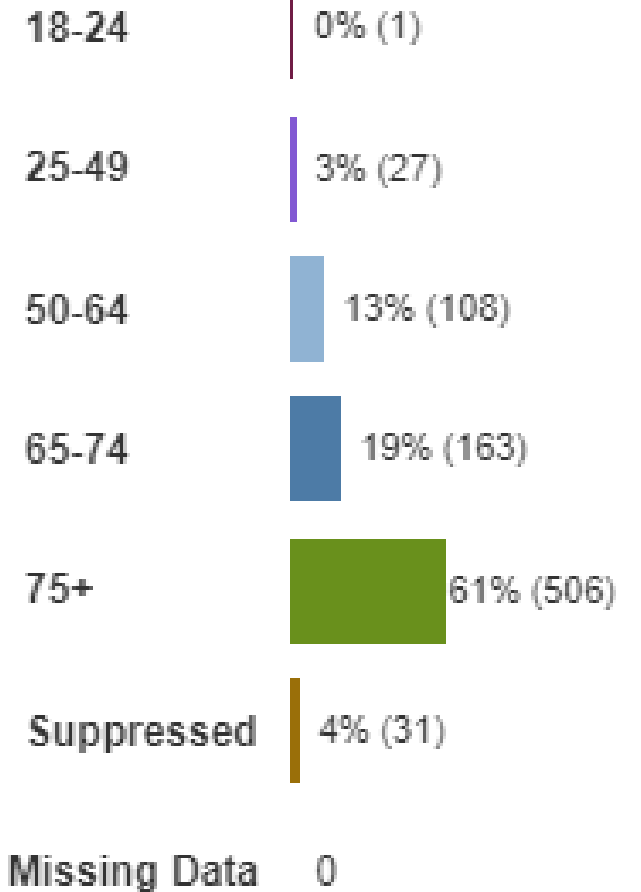


Wake County Deaths by Age

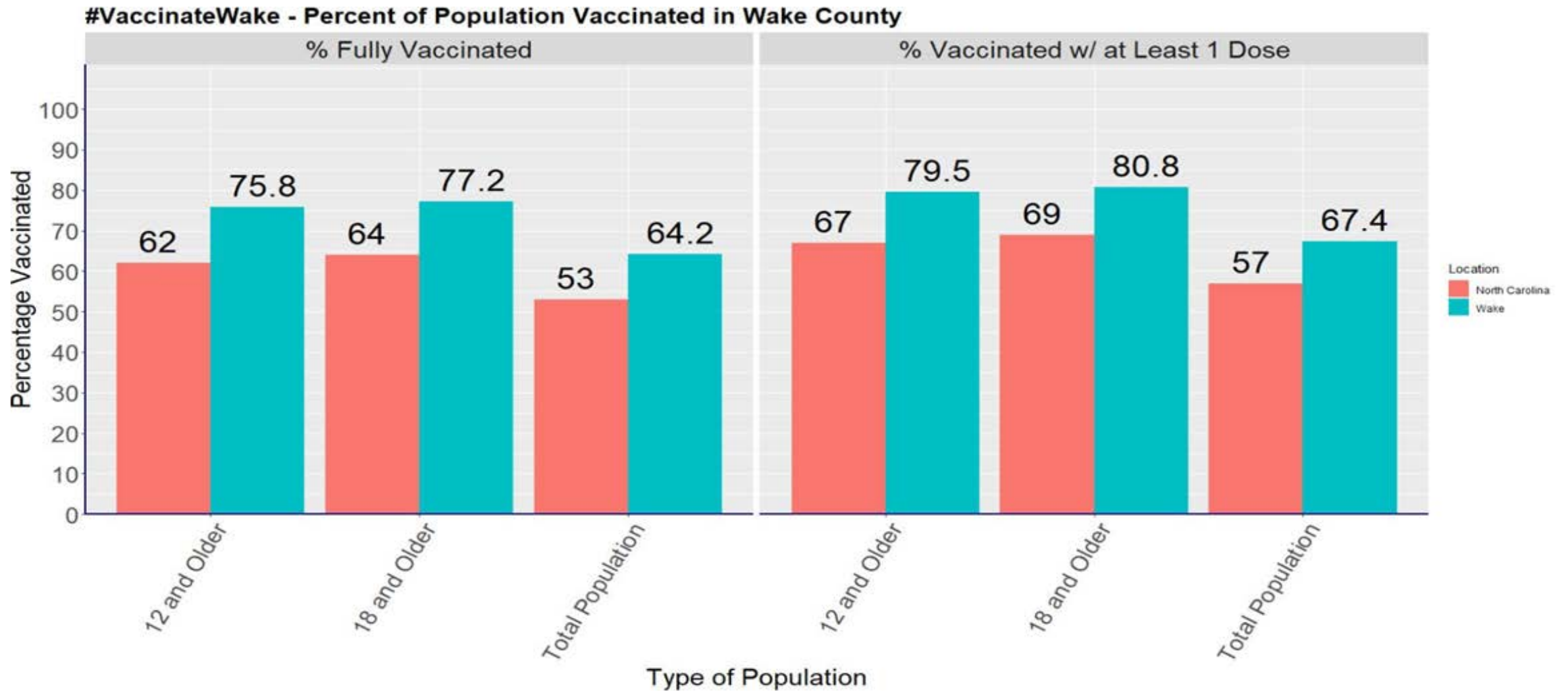
Weekly Deaths Trend



Total Deaths

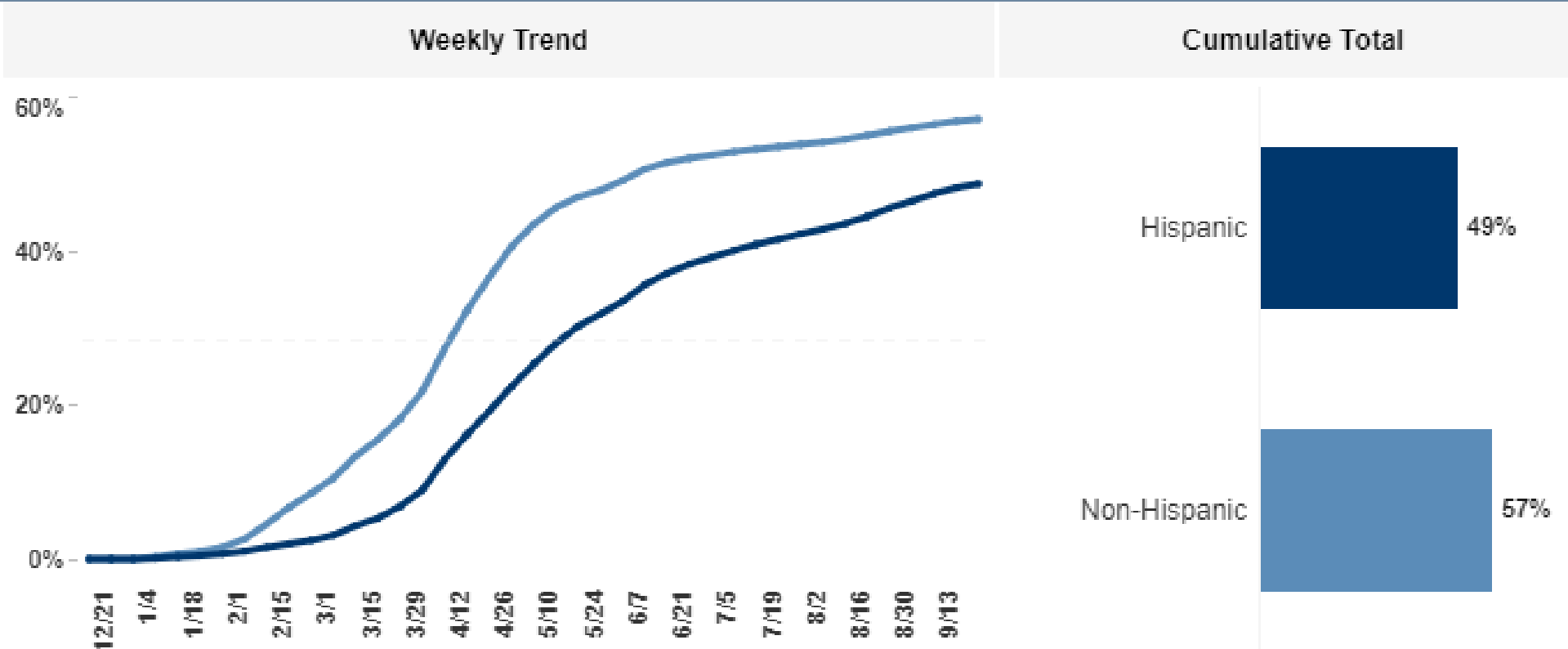


Percent of Population Vaccinated

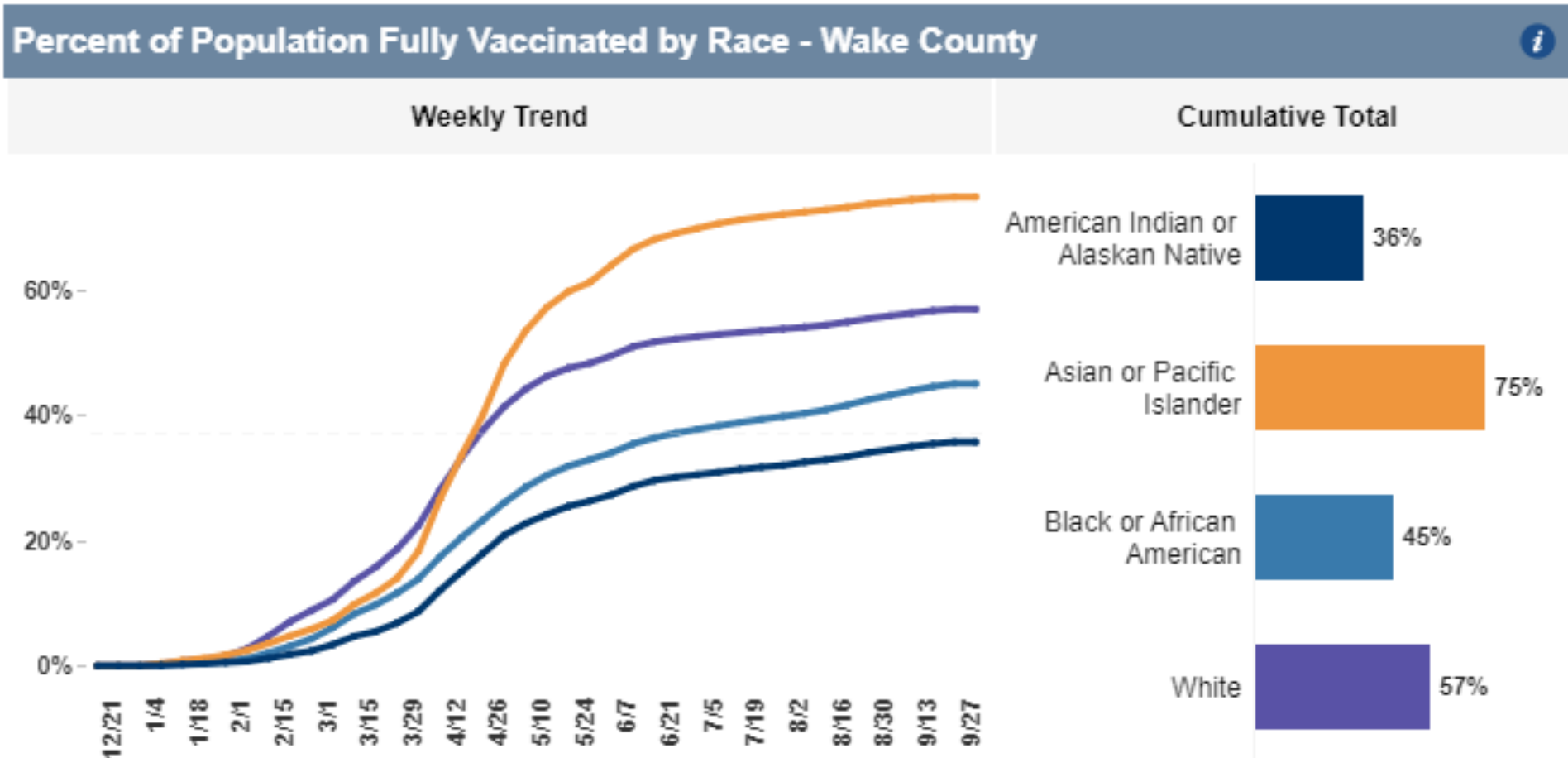


Vaccine Coverage by Ethnicity

Vaccine Coverage by Race



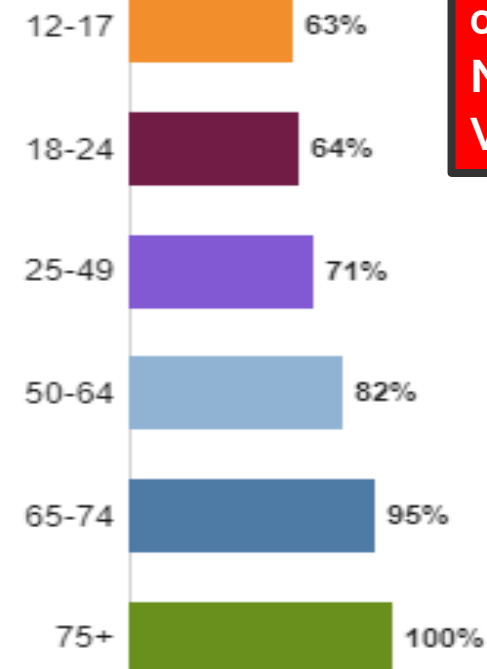
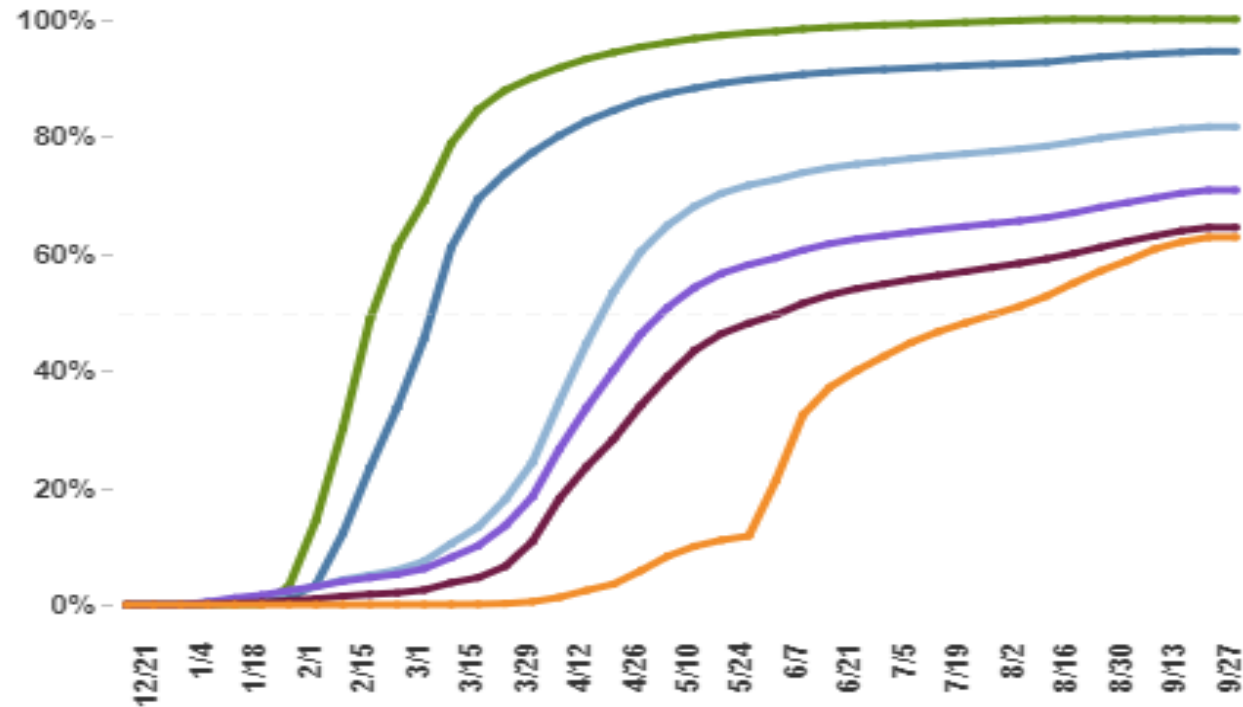
Vaccine Coverage by Age

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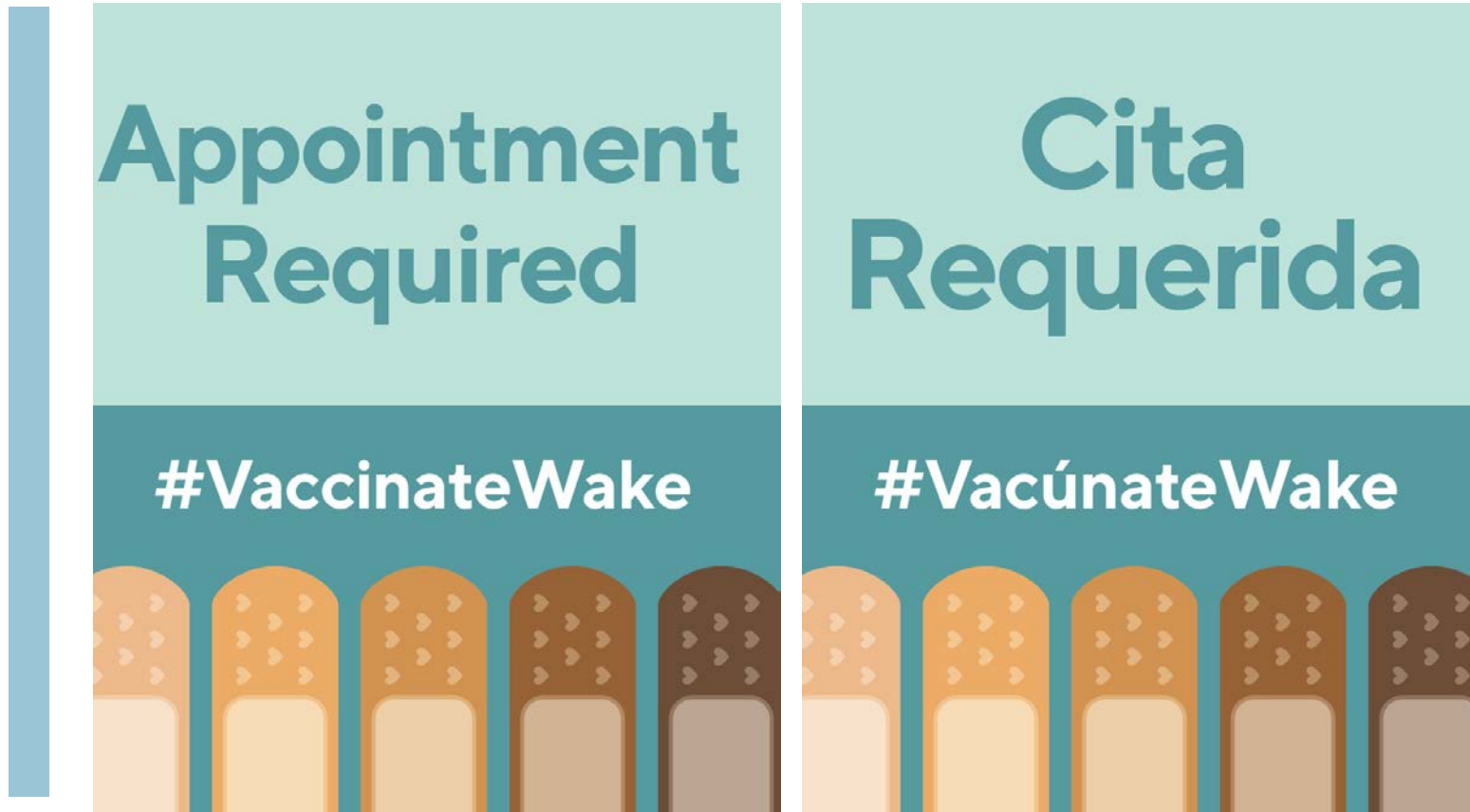
Pfizer Booster Doses

You can get a booster if it has been at least 6 months since your second Pfizer shot, and one of the following is true:

- 1) You are 65 or older
- 2) You are 18 and older and:
 - You live or work in a nursing home or other long-term care residential facility.
 - You have a [medical condition](#) that puts you at high risk for severe illness
 - You work in a [high-risk profession](#), meaning you come into contact with a lot of people, and you don't know their vaccination status
 - You [live or work](#) in a place where many people live together



Strategy Updates
